### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNCLAIMED PROPERTY TRUST FUND.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 523A-25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§523A-25 Agreement to locate property. (a) An agreement 4 by an owner, the primary purpose of which is to locate, deliver, 5 recover, or assist in the recovery of property that is presumed 6 abandoned shall be void and unenforceable if it was entered into 7 during the period commencing on the date the property was 8 presumed abandoned and extending to a time that is twenty-four 9 months after the date the property is paid or delivered to the 10 administrator.

(b) An agreement by an owner, the primary purpose of which is to locate, deliver, recover, or assist in the recovery of property shall be enforceable only if the agreement is in writing, clearly sets forth the nature of the property and the services to be rendered, is signed by the apparent owner, and states the value of the property before and after the fee or other compensation has been deducted.

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(c) If an agreement covered by this section applies to
 mineral proceeds and the agreement contains a provision to pay
 compensation that includes a portion of the underlying minerals
 or any mineral proceeds not then presumed abandoned, the
 provision shall be void and unenforceable.

6 (d) An agreement covered by this section that provides for 7 compensation that exceeds [twenty five] ten per cent of the 8 total value of the property shall be unenforceable except by the 9 owner. An owner who has agreed to pay compensation that exceeds 10 [twenty five] ten per cent of the total value of the property, 11 or the administrator on behalf of the owner, may maintain an 12 action to reduce the compensation to an amount not to exceed 13 [twenty five] ten per cent of the total value of the property. 14 The court may award reasonable attorney's fees to an owner who 15 prevails in the action.

16 (e) This section does not preclude an owner from asserting 17 that an agreement covered by this section is invalid on grounds 18 other than excessive or unjust compensation. The court may 19 award reasonable attorney's fees to an owner who prevails in the 20 action.

21 (f) [This] Notwithstanding subsection (d), this section
22 does not apply to an owner's agreement with an attorney to file

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a claim as to identified property or contest the administrator's
 denial of a claim; provided that:

3 (1) An owner's agreement with an attorney covered by this
4 subsection that provides for compensation shall not
5 exceed twenty-five per cent of the total value of the
6 property, except as provided in paragraph (2); and

7 (2) An owner's agreement with an attorney to maintain an
8 action in circuit court under section 523A-16 may
9 provide for compensation that exceeds twenty-five per
10 cent of the total value of the property only upon

11 approval of the court."

SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE UNCLAIMED PROPERTY TRUST FUND.

PURPOSE: To decrease the compensation cap for nonattorney professional locators from twentyfive percent to ten percent of the total value of property on an owner's agreement to locate and recover unclaimed property.

Amend section 523A-25(d), Hawaii Revised Statues ("HRS").

Currently, section 523A-25(d) sets the JUSTIFICATION: compensation cap for professional locators of unclaimed property at twenty-five percent of the total value of property on an owner's agreement to locate and recover abandoned property. The twenty-five percent compensation cap also pertains to attorneys who assist owners with their claims. Unlike attorneys, the professional locators do not provide specialized legal assistance to owners to warrant compensation of up to twenty-five percent. It would be in the best interest of owners of unclaimed property to reduce the fees of professional locators to ten percent, which was the cap for professional locators prior to the enactment of Act 286, Session Laws of Hawaii The Department of Budget and Finance 2013. does not object to the twenty-five percent cap currently in place for attorneys due to the legal work provided.
