BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended by adding to article 14G a new section to be			
3	appropriately designated and to read as follows:			
4	"§431:14G- Publication of premium information. (a)			
5	Upon the commissioner's request, all managed care plans shall			
6	provide health insurance premium information to the commissioner			
7	within thirty days of the request.			
8	(b) The commissioner shall publish annually, by electronic			
9	or online publication on the official website of the insurance			
10	division, a list of all managed care plans with representative			
11	annual premiums for health insurance. The commissioner shall			
12	have information on premiums for health insurance, which shall			
13	be available to the public on request."

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH

INSURANCE.

PURPOSE:

To allow the Insurance Commissioner to gather health insurance premium information and provide the information to the public.

MEANS:

Add a new section to article 14G of chapter

431, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

Currently, the Insurance Commissioner is allowed to collect and provide information to the public on motor vehicle and home insurance premiums. Under the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Public Law 111-148 (PPACA), individuals are under a mandate to acquire health care coverage. This bill proposes to afford these individuals an opportunity to review and compare health care coverage premiums to assist them in the mandatory selection of coverage.

Impact on the public: This bill is necessary to assist the public in selecting health care coverage by providing premium information and comparisons. Making health insurance information more accessible to the public would help Hawaii consumers make informed decisions when purchasing health insurance.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
This bill should not impact other agencies.
This bill would allow the Insurance
Commissioner to request and compile health
insurance premium information for the
benefit of the public.
