By amending subsection (d) to read: 2 "(d) If funds appropriated for the purpose of making 3 grants under this section are inadequate to satisfy all 4 qualified requests, the development corporation shall apply for 5 funds to be transferred from the Hawaii capital loan revolving 6 fund to provide the grants in accordance with subsection (b). 7 The amount of any single transfer of funds shall not exceed 8 [\$100,000,] \$, and the development corporation shall 9 transfer the entire amount back to the Hawaii capital loan revolving fund within twelve months of receiving the funds. 10 No 11 more than one fund transfer shall be outstanding at any one 12 The director of business, economic development, and time. 13 tourism may transfer funds from the Hawaii capital loan 14 revolving fund to the development corporation upon request to 15 carry out the purposes of this section.
