
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii-grown coffee
- 2 is recognized for its high quality and aromatic flavor. Hawaii-
- 3 grown coffee is held to a set of high quality standards, which
- 4 makes it one of the most expensive coffees in the world.
- 5 According to Statistics of Hawaii Agriculture, the estimated
- 6 value of Hawaii-grown coffee in 2011 was \$31,540,000, ranking it
- 7 fifth in the top twenty agricultural commodities in the State.
- 8 To protect the Hawaii coffee industry from counterfeiting,
- 9 the legislature in 2012 enacted Act 328, Session Laws of Hawaii
- 10 2012, which established criminal penalties for Hawaii-grown
- 11 cherry, parchment, and green coffee that is falsely labeled with
- 12 regard to the geographic origin. However, in addition to the
- 13 geographic origin, stricter enforcement on the labeling
- 14 restrictions based on the quality of the coffee being sold is
- 15 critical to prevent further counterfeiting of Hawaii's
- 16 recognized high quality coffee. Furthermore, the criminal
- 17 penalties for false labeling should apply not only to cherry,
- 18 parchment, and green coffee, but also to roasted coffee.





- 1 The purpose of this Act is to extend the offense of false 2 labeling of Hawaii-grown coffee to include violations of grade 3 standard requirements and all stages of coffee production. 4 SECTION 2. Section 708-871.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by amending its title and subsections (1) and (2) to read as follows: 6 7 "[+]\$708-871.5[+] False labeling of Hawaii-grown coffee. 8 (1) A person commits the offense of false labeling of Hawaii-9 grown coffee if the person knowingly transports, distributes, **10** advertises, sells, or possesses with the intent to sell Hawaii-11 grown [green] coffee [, cherry coffee, or parchment coffee] that 12 is falsely labeled with regard to the geographic origin of the Hawaii-grown coffee[-] or the grade standard requirements **13** 14 established by rules adopted under chapter 147. 15 For purposes of this section: (2) **16** ["Cherry coffee" means the unprocessed fruit of the coffee 17 plant.] 18 "Geographic origin" means the geographic areas designated
- (a) Hamakua is the Hamakua district on the island ofHawaii, as designated by the State of Hawaii tax map;
- (b) Hawaii is the State of Hawaii;

as follows:

- (c) Kau is the Kau district on the island of Hawaii, as
 designated by the State of Hawaii tax map;
- 3 (d) Kauai is the island of Kauai;
- (e) Kona is the north Kona and south Kona districts on the
 island of Hawaii, as designated by the State of Hawaii
 tax map;
- 7 (f) Maui is the island of Maui;
- 8 (g) Molokai is the island of Molokai; and
- 9 (h) Oahu is the island of Oahu.
- 10 ["Green coffee" means the agricultural commodity comprised
- 11 of green coffee beans.
- 12 "Parchment coffee" means the dried product that remains
- 13 when coffee cherries are processed by removing the coffee seeds
- 14 from the pulp.]"
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 16 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 17 begun before its effective date.
- 18 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
