A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE BUILDING CODES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The state building code council was created in
- 2 2007 to review and adopt a comprehensive suite of the latest
- 3 editions of nationally recognized building codes and standards
- 4 for the State of Hawaii. The staffing and operating expenses of
- 5 the council, however, have never been funded, thereby limiting
- 6 the effectiveness of the work of the nine voting members, who
- 7 consist of state and county government regulators and private
- 8 stakeholders. This Act adds building industry and trade
- 9 representatives to the membership of the council; allows
- 10 staggering in the timeframe of the adoption of the codes;
- 11 defines and clarifies terminology; ensures the laws governing
- 12 building contractors do not conflict with chapter 107, Hawaii
- 13 Revised Statutes; and makes an appropriation to fund the
- 14 operations of the council.
- 15 SECTION 2. Part II of chapter 107, Hawaii Revised
- 16 Statutes, is amended by amending its title to read:
- 17 "PART II. [STATE BUILDING CODE AND DESIGN STANDARDS]

18 HAWAII STATE BUILDING CODES"

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- 1 SECTION 3. Section 107-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended as follows:
- 3 1. By adding two new definitions to be appropriately
- 4 inserted and to read:
- 5 ""Codes and standards" means nationally recognized minimum
- 6 requirements for design and construction to safeguard life,
- 7 property, and the general welfare.
- 8 "Hawaii state building codes" means the building codes and
- 9 standards that the state building code council adopts under
- 10 section 107-24."
- 11 2. By amending the definition of "hurricane resistive
- 12 criteria" to read:
- 13 ""Hurricane [resistive] resistant criteria" means the
- 14 design criteria for enhanced hurricane protection areas that are
- 15 capable of withstanding a five hundred-year hurricane event, as
- 16 developed by the state department of defense for public shelter
- 17 and residential safe room design criteria."
- 18 SECTION 4. Section 107-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
- "(a) There is established a state building code council.
- 21 The council shall be placed within the department of accounting
- 22 and general services for administrative purposes only. The

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1 council shall consist of [nine] eleven voting members and one 2 nonvoting member, who shall be the comptroller or the 3 comptroller's designee. The council members shall serve four-4 year terms as defined in paragraphs (1) to [-(6).] (8). 5 voting members shall include: One county building official from each of the four 6 (1)7 counties appointed by the mayor; (2) One member representing the state fire council; 9 (3) One member representing the department of health who 10 has significant experience in building mechanical and 11 sewage disposal systems; 12 (4) (3) One member representing the department of labor 13 and industrial relations who has significant 14 experience in elevator [or fire] safety; 15 (4)One member representing the Hawaii state energy office of the department of business, economic development, 16 **17** and tourism; 18 (5) One member representing the Structural Engineers 19 Association of Hawaii; [and] 20 (6) One member representing the American Institute of Architects, Hawaii State Council[-]; 21

8	(b)	[Six] Seven voting members shall constitute a quorum.	
9	The chair	person of the council shall be elected annually from	
10	among its	members by a majority vote of the members of the	
11	council."		
12	SECT	ION 5. Section 107-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
13	amended to read as follows:		
14	"[+]	§107-23[] Executive director and executive	
15	assistant	• (a) The council shall appoint, exempt from chapters	
16	76 and 89	, an executive director, who shall serve at the	
17	pleasure	of the council, and who shall have administrative	
18	abilities and [expertise in engineering or architecture.]

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         SECTION 6. Section 107-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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         "[+]$107-24[+] Authority and duties of the council. (a)
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    Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the council shall
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    establish [a-comprehensive] the Hawaii state building [code.]

              The council shall appoint a subcommittee [comprised
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         (b)

    of] comprising the four council members representing county
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    building officials, whose duty shall be to recommend any
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    necessary or desirable state amendments to the [model] codes[-]
    and standards identified in section 107-25. Any recommended
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    state amendments shall require the unanimous agreement of the
    subcommittee. The council shall designate the staggering of the
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    adoption of the codes and standards to be adopted, amended, and
    updated. The frequency of the adoption of any code or standard
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- 1 shall not exceed every six years. Any recommended staggering of
- 2 the adoption of codes and standards shall be based on a review
- 3 and evaluation of the utility of each code and standard
- 4 identified in section 107-25 when each edition is published.
- 5 (c) The council may appoint other investigative, technical
- 6 expertise committees, which may include council members.
- 7 (d) The council shall consult with [general] building
- 8 contractor associations and building trade associations to
- 9 gather information and recommendations on construction practices
- 10 and training relevant to building codes and standards.
- (e) The council shall review and adopt, as appropriate,
- 12 new model building codes within eighteen months of the official
- 13 publication date.
- 14 (f) The council may make expenditures for technical
- 15 references, equipment and supplies, and other operating
- 16 expenses, and may contract for the conduct of research studies
- 17 and other technical services.
- (g) The council [shall] may provide education and
- 19 technical training and administrative assistance in the form of
- 20 services or grants at the state and county levels relating to
- 21 the implementation and enforcement of the Hawaii state building
- 22 [code] codes adopted pursuant to this part.

4	SECTION 7. Section 107-25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
5	amended to read as follows:

7	requirements. There [is] are established [a] the Hawaii state		
8	building [codes applicable to all construction in the		
9	State of Hawaii. The <u>Hawaii</u> state building [codes shall		
10	[include:] be based upon:		
11	(1) The [latest edition of the] state fire code as adopted		
12	by the state fire council;		
13	(2) The [latest edition of the] Uniform Plumbing Code, as		
14	copyrighted and published by the International		
15	Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials,		
16	including its appendices;		
17	(3) The [latest edition of the] International Building		
18	Code, the International Residential Code, and the		
19	International Energy Conservation Code, as published		
20	by the International Code Council;		
21	(4) The National Electrical Code, as published by the		
22	National Fire Protection Association;

2	prohibitions. In adopting [a] the Hawaii state building [code,]
3	codes, the council shall not adopt provisions that:
4	(1) Relate to administrative, permitting, or enforcement
5	and inspection procedures of each county; or
6	(2) Conflict with [chapter] chapters 444 and 464."
7	SECTION 9. Section 107-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended to read as follows:
9	"[+]\$107-27[] Exemptions.] Design of state buildings.
10	(a) [Upon] <u>No later than one year after the</u> adoption of rules
11	under this chapter, the design of all state building
12	construction shall be in compliance with the <u>Hawaii</u> state
13	building [code within one year of its effective date, and]
14	codes, except that state building construction shall be allowed
15	to be exempted from:
16	(1) County codes that have not adopted the Hawaii state
17	building [code;] <u>codes;</u>
18	(2) Any county code amendments that are inconsistent with
19	the minimum performance objectives of the <u>Hawaii</u> state
20	building [codes] codes or the objectives enumerated in
21	this part; or

- (3) Any county code amendments that are contrary to code
 amendments adopted by another county.
- 3 (b) Exemptions shall include county ordinances allowing
- 4 the exercise of indigenous Hawaiian architecture adopted in
- 5 accordance with section 46-1.55."
- 6 SECTION 10. Section 107-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 "[f] \$107-28[f] County [building code] authority to amend
- 9 and adopt the Hawaii state [model] building [code] codes without
- 10 [state] council approval. (a) The governing body of each
- 11 county shall amend, adopt, and update the Hawaii state building
- 12 [code] codes as [it applies] they apply within its respective
- 13 jurisdiction, in accordance with section 46-1.5(13), without
- 14 approval of the council. Each county shall [use] amend and
- 15 adopt the [model] Hawaii state building codes and standards
- 16 listed in section 107-25, as the referenced [model] Hawaii state
- 17 building codes and standards for its respective county building
- 18 code ordinance, no later than two years after the adoption of
- 19 the Hawaii state building [code.] codes.
- 20 (b) If a county does not amend the [statewide model code]
- 21 Hawaii state building codes within the two-year time frame, the
- 22 <u>Hawaii</u> state building [code] codes shall become applicable as an



- 1 interim county building code [until the county adopts the
- 2 amendments]."
- 3 SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 and the
- 6 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 7 2015-2016 for the operations of the state building code council,
- 8 including salaries for staff personnel, training, travel, and
- 9 technical assistance services.
- 10 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 11 of accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 12. This Act does not affect the rights and duties
- 13 that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
- 14 were begun before its effective date.
- 15 SECTION 13. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
