A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOPEDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTI	ON 1. Mopeds are a cheaper alternative to driving a
2	vehicle.	As the cost of gasoline increases, moped sales and the
3	use of mop	eds also increases. According to the City and County
4	of Honolul	u, the number of registered mopeds in Honolulu
5	increased	every year between 2006 and 2012. Additionally, there
6	were three	hundred fifty-four mopeds involved in major traffic
7	accidents	on public roadways in 2012.
8	The 1	egislature finds that public safety is a state
9	priority.	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to increase
10	public saf	ety by, among other things:
11	(1)	Requiring all mopeds to be registered on a staggered
12		basis, as established by each county;
13	(2)	Prohibiting the use of a moped that is not in good
14		working order on public roadways;
15	(3)	Extending certain police powers dealing with vehicle
16		inspections to include mopeds;
17	(4)	Requiring a certificate of inspection for all mopeds;

Including a penalty for a false certificate of 1 (5) 2 inspection for mopeds; 3 Requiring moped operators to enroll in a safety course (6) 4 to operate their mopeds; and 5 Increasing the fine for modifying a moped. (7) 6 SECTION 2. Section 249-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 8 "(a) Bicycles having two tandem wheels that are twenty 9 inches or more in diameter [and all mopeds are required to] **10** shall be registered and shall be subject to a permanent 11 registration fee of \$15, to be paid by the owners thereof to the 12 director of finance. **13** All mopeds shall be registered on a staggered basis, as 14 established by each county and based upon the month of initial 15 registration, and shall be subject to an annual registration fee 16 of \$15, to be paid by the owners thereof to the director of finance. The owner of the moped shall submit a current official **17** 18 certificate of inspection issued under section 286-26 as part of 19 the registration." 20 SECTION 3. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 21 amended by amending the title of part II to read as follows:

1 INSPECTION OF VEHICLES AND MOPEDS" "PART II. 2 SECTION 4. Section 286-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 amended to read as follows: 4 "§286-21 Vehicles and mopeds without required equipment or 5 in unsafe condition. No person shall drive or cause to move on 6 any highway any motor vehicle, moped, trailer, semitrailer, or 7 pole trailer, or any combination thereof, unless the equipment 8 thereon is in good working order and adjustment as required in 9 this part [so as not to] and does not endanger the driver [or], **10** any other occupant, or any person [upon] on the highway." 11 SECTION 5. Section 286-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended by amending subsections (a) through (c) to read as 13 follows: 14 [The chief of police or any police officer of any 15 county may, at] At any time when the chief of police or police 16 officer has reasonable cause to believe that a vehicle or moped **17** is unsafe or not equipped as required by law, the chief of 18 police or any police officer of any county may require the owner 19 or driver of the vehicle or moped to submit the vehicle or moped 20 to an inspection or make the necessary corrections or repairs. If the vehicle or moped is found to be in an unsafe 21 22 condition or if any required part or equipment is not present or



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if any required part or equipment is present but not in proper 2 repair, the officer shall issue a citation to the owner or 3 driver stating the reasons that the vehicle is deemed unsafe or 4 the moped is deemed unsafe or not equipped as required and shall 5 require that a new certificate of inspection as provided in 6 section 286-26 be obtained within five days or that the defect 7 be cured. 8 If upon inspection, the chief of police or any police 9 officer determines that any vehicle or moped is in such unsafe 10 condition as to constitute a menace to the public or determines 11 that the moped is not equipped as required in this part and 12 cannot reasonably be restored to a safe condition or with 13 respect to mopeds, equipped as required in this part, the chief of police or police officer shall remove the sticker [which] 14 15 that signifies the certificate of inspection and, with regard to 16 vehicles, inform the director of finance, who shall [forthwith] 17 immediately suspend the registration of the vehicle and give 18 notice of the suspension to its owner. Whenever the director of 19 finance has suspended the registration of any vehicle under this 20 part, the owner of the vehicle shall immediately surrender and forward to the director of finance the certificate of 21

registration and the license plates last issued upon 1 2 registration of the vehicle for the current year." 3 SECTION 6. Section 286-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 5 No person shall operate any vehicle or moped after 6 receiving a citation with reference thereto as provided in 7 section 286-22(b), except that if the driver is authorized to do 8 so by the police officer, the driver may return the vehicle or moped to the driver's residence or place of business or the 9 10 residence or place of business of the owner of the vehicle[7] or 11 moped, or to an automotive repair shop, if within a distance of 12 twenty miles, until a certificate of inspection is obtained or **13** the necessary corrections or repairs are made." 14 SECTION 7. Section 286-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is **15** amended to read as follows: 16 "§286-24 [Registered owner's responsibility; registration plates as prima facie evidence as to the fault of the registered **17** 18 owner.] Responsibility of owner or operator for violation. 19 any proceeding for violation of this part, the registered owner 20 of a vehicle or the owner or operator of a moped shall be deemed 21 responsible for the unsafe condition of the vehicle [-] or moped,

or of the failure to equip the moped as required by law."



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SECTION 8. Section 286-25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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         "§286-25 Operation of a vehicle or moped without a
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    certificate of inspection. Whoever operates, permits the
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    operation of, causes to be operated, or parks any vehicle or
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    moped on a public highway without a current official certificate
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    of inspection, issued under section 286-26, shall be fined not
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    more than $100."
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         SECTION 9. Section 286-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended as follows:
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              By amending subsections (b) and (c) to read:
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               [All other] Mopeds and vehicles[7] other than those
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    under subsection (a), including motorcycles, trailers,
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    semitrailers, and pole trailers having a gross vehicle weight
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    rating of [10,000] ten thousand pounds or less, and antique
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    motor vehicles as defined in section 249-1, except those in
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    subsections (c) and (d), shall be certified as provided in
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    subsection (e) every twelve months; provided that any vehicle or
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    moped to which this subsection applies shall not require
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    inspection within two years of the date on which the vehicle or
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    moped was first sold.
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(c) Any vehicle or moped that has been involved in an		
accident shall be certified as provided in subsection (e) before		
it is operated again if:		
(1) It is determined by a police officer or an insurer		
that the vehicle's or moped's equipment has been		
damaged so as to render the vehicle or moped unsafe;		
or .		
(2) It is rebuilt or restored."		
2. By amending subsections (e) through (g) to read:		
"(e) Upon application for a certificate of inspection to		
be issued for a vehicle[-] or moped, an inspection as prescribed		
by the director under subsection (g) shall be conducted on the		
vehicle[7] or moped, and if the vehicle or moped is found to be		
in a safe operating condition, a certificate of inspection shall		
be issued upon payment of a fee to be determined by the		
director. The certificate for a motor vehicle shall state the		
effective date, the termination date, the name of the issuing		
insurance carrier, and the policy number of the motor vehicle		
insurance identification card for the inspected motor vehicle as		
specified by section 431:10C-107 or state the information		
contained in the proof of insurance card as specified by section		
431:10G-106. A sticker, authorized by the director, shall be		

- 1 affixed to the vehicle or moped at the time a certificate of
- 2 inspection is issued. An inspection sticker [which] that has
- 3 been lost, stolen, or destroyed shall be replaced without
- 4 reinspection by the inspection station that issued the original
- 5 inspection sticker upon presentation of the [vehicle's] current
- 6 certificate of inspection[+] for the vehicle or moped; provided
- 7 that the current certificate of inspection and inspection
- 8 sticker shall not have expired at the time the replacement is
- 9 requested. The director shall adopt rules to determine the fee
- 10 for replacement of lost, stolen, or destroyed inspection
- 11 stickers.
- 12 (f) The operator of an official inspection station shall
- 13 pay, from the fee in subsection (e), an amount to be determined
- 14 by rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91 to the director of
- 15 transportation. This amount shall be expended only for
- 16 administration and enforcement of the periodic motor vehicle and
- 17 moped inspection program. The funds collected pursuant to this
- 18 subsection shall be deposited into the highway special fund.
- 19 (g) The director of transportation shall adopt necessary
- 20 rules for the administration of inspections and the issuance of
- 21 certificates of inspection[-]; provided that mopeds manufactured
- 22 after December 31, 2014, shall be issued a certificate of



- 1 inspection only if the exhaust system of the moped meets the
- 2 specifications of the original manufacturer, and all other
- 3 applicable requirements for the issuance of a certificate of
- 4 inspection are satisfied."
- 5 SECTION 10. Section 286-30, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 "\$286-30 False certificates. Any person who makes,
- 8 issues, or knowingly uses any imitation or counterfeit of an
- 9 official certificate of inspection, or any person who displays
- 10 or causes or permits to be displayed upon any vehicle or moped
- 11 any certificate of inspection knowing the same to be issued for
- 12 another vehicle or issued without an inspection having been made
- 13 or issued without authority as provided herein shall be fined
- 14 [not more than] up to \$1,000 or imprisoned not more than thirty
- 15 days, or both."
- 16 SECTION 11. Section 291C-194, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended as follows:
- 18 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
- "(a) No person shall drive a moped unless the person:
- 20 (1) Possesses a valid driver's license of any category
- 21 listed in section 286-102 or 286-239; [and]
- 22 (2) Meets the requirements of section 286-105(3)[-]; and

1	(3) Has taken and passed a moped education course approved		
2	by the department of transportation."		
3	2. By amending subsection (c) to read:		
4	"(c) Any person who is convicted of violating this section		
5	shall be subject to penalties as provided under section 291C-		
6	161(b) and [+](f)[+]."		
7	SECTION 12. Section 291C-206, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
8	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:		
9	"(b) Any person who violates this section shall be fined		
10	not more than [\$500.] \$1,000."		
11	SECTION 13. This Act does not affect rights and duties		
12	that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that		
13	were begun before its effective date.		
14	SECTION 14. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
15	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
16	SECTION 15. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2015.
