#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 [(c)] (d) Immediately to the left of (before) or to the 2 right of (after) the candidate name or names, according to the 3 requirements of the voting system, two vertical lines shall be 4 ruled, so that in conjunction with the horizontal lines, a box 5 shall be formed to the left of or to the right of the name and 6 its equivalent, if any.

7  $\left[-\frac{1}{2}\right]$  (e) In case of the candidates for president and vice 8 president and governor and lieutenant governor of the same political party, only one box shall be formed opposite their set 9 of names. The boxes shall be of sufficient size to give ample 10 11 room in which to designate the choice of the voter in the manner 12 prescribed for the voting system in use. All of the names upon a ballot shall be placed at a uniform distance from the left 13 edge and close thereto, and shall be of uniform size and print 14 subject to section 11-119." 15

16 SECTION 2. The chief election officer is directed to 17 establish procedures to implement the purpose of this Act, which 18 shall apply to the first full two year election cycle next 19 following the effective date of this Act.

20 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
