A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Hawaii's public school system is undergoing
- 2 many important changes and enhancements to better ensure that
- 3 our children will be ready to compete in a global arena upon
- 4 graduation from high school.
- 5 To better promote student success within the
- 6 internationally-benchmarked common core standards, the
- 7 department of education, within the parameters of existing
- 8 support services, needs to ensure earlier detection of existing
- 9 learning obstacles and implement more focused solutions to
- 10 encourage the realization of student potential on a daily basis.
- 11 In addition, Hawaii's educators and school administrators
- 12 need more easily-accessible tools. A web-based systemic
- 13 comparison of variables that positively impact student
- 14 performance, including a comparison of the most effective
- 15 learning practices, together on one webpage, would be
- 16 tremendously beneficial.

1	Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to:
2	(1) Establish a pilot project to assist students in
3	achieving annual goals under the common core state
4	standards; and
5	(2) Develop a plan to provide web-based data and
6	information for each public school aimed at improving
7	student outcomes.
8	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
10	and to read as follows:

15	(b)	The board, in collaboration with stakeholders deemed
16	necessary	by the department, shall incorporate and maintain the
17	following	information on the department's intranet:
18	(1)	General information on how an educator can reclassify
19		for pay increases;
20	(2)	Teacher support practices by school complex in cases
21		where such practices are not implemented uniformly
22		across the State, including information on teacher

1		training and development, teacher assessment,
2	•	effective teaching models or techniques, principal
3		leadership style, instructional materials used, and
4		information regarding other tools and techniques the

8	<u>(3)</u>	A brief and adequate description from the department
9		of general best practices based upon the most recent
10		research on how students learn; and
11	(4)	Information on teacher-parent communication practices
12		and other crucial support services from governmental
13		and non-governmental entities.
14	(c)_	The required information listed in subsections (a) and
15	(b) shall	not preclude the board or the department from
16	including	additional information deemed necessary."
17	SECT:	ION 3. (a) The board of education, in collaboration

3	(c) The pilot program shall be implemented for two school
4	years beginning with the 2015-2016 school year. The board of
5	education, in collaboration with necessary stakeholders
6	identified by the department of education and the invited
7	participation of the exclusive bargaining agent representing
8	educational officers, shall make necessary adjustments to
9	improve the program after the first year.
10	(d) If the board of education deems the pilot program
11	successful, the pilot program shall be implemented for all
12	grades beginning with the 2017-2018 school year.
13	(e) The board of education shall submit a progress report,
14	including findings and recommendations, to the legislature no
15	later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
16	session of 2016 and a final report, including findings,
17	recommendations, and any proposed legislation necessary to apply
18	the program to all grade levels on a continuing basis, no later
19	than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
20	of 2017.
21	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general

revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$5,000,000 or so much

- 1 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the
- 2 development and implementation of the pilot program and webpage
- 3 required by this Act.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 5 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 5. The appropriation made by section 4 of this Act
- 7 shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year for which the
- 8 appropriation is made; provided that all unencumbered moneys as
- 9 of June 30, 2017, shall lapse to the credit of the general fund.
- 10 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
