### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. This Act shall be known as The Hawaii			
2	Innovation	ns Fund Act.			
3	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
4	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated				
5	and to read as follows:				
6	" <u>§304</u>	The Hawaii innovations fund. (a) There shall			
7	be establ	ished in the state treasury a fund to be known as the			
8	<u>Hawaii inr</u>	novations fund that shall be administratively attached			
9	to the University of Hawaii.				
10	(b)	The objective of the Hawaii innovations fund shall be			
11	<u>to:</u>				
12	<u>(1)</u>	Stimulate economic development in life sciences and			
13		advanced technology using the resources of the			
14		University of Hawaii, including the John A. Burns			
15		School of Medicine;			
16	(2)	Create high-quality, high-income job opportunities in			
17		the life sciences and advanced technology fields,			

1		including jobs for graduates of post-college programs;		
2		and		
3	<u>(3)</u>	Provide incentives for residents to stay and work in		
4		Hawaii and encourage former residents to return to		
5		Hawaii.		
6	<u>То а</u>	ccomplish these objectives, which are deemed to be		
7	public pu	rposes, moneys in the Hawaii innovations fund shall be		
8	used to f	und grants to individuals or businesses that conduct		
9	research or product development in the life sciences or advanced			
10	technology fields.			
11	(c)	From July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015, the Hawaii		
12	innovatio	ns fund shall be funded by appropriations from the		
13	legislatu	re. After June 30, 2015, one-half of one per cent of		
14	general f	und revenues collected shall be deposited into the		
15	<u>Hawaii in</u>	novations fund on a monthly basis; provided that after		
16	June 30,	2019, no funding shall be provided to the Hawaii		
17	innovatio	ns fund.		
18	<u>(d)</u>	The Hawaii innovations fund shall be administered by		
19	the Hawai	i innovations fund community board consisting of eleven		
20	voting me	mbers as follows:		
21	(1)	Four ex officio members as follows:		



1		<u>(A)</u>	The director of business, economic development,			
2			and tourism;			
3		(B)	The dean of the University of Hawaii John A.			
4			Burns school of medicine;			
5		<u>(C)</u>	The president of the Hawaii science and			
6			technology council; and			
7		<u>(D)</u>	The president and chief executive officer of			
8			Enterprise Honolulu;			
9	(2)	Thre	e members appointed by the governor;			
10	(3)	Two	members appointed by the governor from a list of			
11		nomi	nees submitted by the speaker of the house of			
12		repr	resentatives; and			
13	(4)	Two	members appointed by the governor from a list of			
14	-	nomi	nees submitted by the president of the senate.			
15	Each	memb	er appointed shall possess national reputations as			
16	experts in the field of life sciences or advanced technology.					
17	The board shall elect a chairperson from among its members.					
18	Six members shall constitute a quorum, whose affirmative vote					
19	shall be necessary for all valid actions by the board. Members					
20	shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for					
21	expenses, including travel expenses, necessary for the					
22	performance of their duties.					
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1	<u>(e)</u>	The Hawaii innovations fund community board shall:
2	(1)	Establish procedures and policies for grant
3		applications;
4	(2)	Develop standards and criteria to determine grant
5		awardees, with priority assigned to grant applicants
6		that:
7		(A) Provide matching funding;
8		(B) Reside or are based in Hawaii;
9		(C) Provide high-paying jobs for residents or former
10		residents of Hawaii;
11		(D) Provide significant return on investment from
12		grant awards; or
13		(E) Use grant awards as seed money to obtain
14		additional research funding for projects in the
15		life sciences or advanced technology fields based
16		in Hawaii;
17	<u>(3)</u>	Select grant awardees;
18	(4)	Set criteria and standards for evaluation of projects
19		receiving grants; and
20	(5)	Provide technical support services to grant awardees
21		that foster marketing and development of the product
22		or service produced through the grant.

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- 1 (f) For the purpose of this section:
- 2 "Advanced technology" means digital media,
- 3 telecommunications, and related fields.
- 4 "Life sciences" means biology, cancer research, community
- 5 healthcare, ocean sciences, agriculture, pharmacology,
- 6 biotechnology, medical technology, biological renewable energy,
- 7 or related fields."
- 8 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000,000 or so
- 10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to be
- 11 deposited into the Hawaii innovations fund.
- 12 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii
- 13 innovations fund the sum of \$100,000,000 or so much thereof as
- 14 may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to be used for the
- 15 purposes of this Act.
- 16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 17 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general fund
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000 or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 as a
- 21 grant-in-aid to the Hawaii science and technology council to
- 22 provide administrative support for the Hawaii innovations fund.

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1	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University	of						
2	Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.							
3	SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.							

- 4 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 5 provided that:

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- (1) Sections 3, 4, and 5 shall take effect on July 1,2014; and
  - (2) This Act shall be repealed on June 30, 2020, and all unencumbered and unexpended balances remaining in the Hawaii innovations fund shall be transferred to the credit of the general fund.

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### Report Title:

Hawaii Innovations Fund; Establishment; Appropriations

#### Description:

Establishes the Hawaii innovations fund to provide grants to individuals or businesses that conduct research or product development in the life sciences or advanced technology fields; establishes objectives of the fund; establishes the Hawaii innovations fund community board; appropriates funds for the start-up and administration of the fund.

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
