# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO JUVENILE JUSTICE.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many youth currently
 placed in the Hawaii youth correctional facility could be safely
 supervised in their communities and provided with treatment and
 programming to reduce future delinquency in more cost-effective
 ways.

6 The legislature further finds that to more effectively 7 respond to juvenile delinquency, and to provide adequate 8 supervision for youth in their communities, Hawaii must fund 9 practices proven to reduce recidivism. Funding for such 10 evidence-based practices must take the form of an upfront 11 investment in the initial fiscal year, followed by regular 12 reinvestment of savings from the budget for the Hawaii youth 13 correctional facility.

14 The legislature also finds that many justice system15 involved youth are in need of mental health treatment, substance
16 abuse treatment, and other practices or interventions that are
17 proven to reduce the likelihood of future delinquency in cost18 effective ways. It is important to fund statewide practices
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that are proven to address mental health and substance abuse
 issues.

3 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for
4 evidence-based practices and programs that will reduce future
5 delinquency by Hawaii's youth in cost-effective ways, including
6 the funding of mental health and substance abuse treatment
7 programs.

8 SECTION 2. (a) In the last month of every fiscal year, 9 the executive director of the office of youth services shall 10 certify to the director of finance the amount of unexpended 11 funds after the objectives and purposes of the appropriations 12 made in the Hawaii youth correctional facility budget have been 13 met due to average daily population reductions in the Hawaii 14 youth correctional facility. No later than July 1 of every 15 year, the director of finance shall transfer the unexpended 16 funds certified by the executive director of the office of youth 17 services to the family court division of the judiciary to fund evidence-based practices intended to reduce recidivism and 18 19 improve outcomes for youth who otherwise would likely have been 20 sent to the Hawaii youth correctional facility. The family 21 court division shall divide the funds among the four judicial 22 circuits in the following percentages:



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1 The first circuit: forty-five per cent; (1)2 (2)The second circuit: twenty-five per cent; 3 (3) The third circuit: twenty per cent; and The fifth circuit: ten per cent. 4 (4)The family court division shall submit annual reports 5 (b) 6 to the legislature reporting the services or programs funded 7 pursuant to this section, the number of youth served by each service or program, and the case outcomes for youth. 8 9 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 11 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for 12 evidence-based practices intended to reduce recidivism and improve outcomes for youth who otherwise would likely be sent to 13 14 the Hawaii youth correctional facility. 15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the family court 16 division of the judiciary for the purposes of this Act. 17 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 18 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for 19

recidivism among court-involved youth or youth placed on probation; provided that the office of youth services shall submit annual reports to the legislature describing the services or programs funded, the number of youth served by each service or program, and the aggregate outcomes for those youth. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of human services for the purposes of this Act.

8 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.



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#### Report Title:
