RELATING TO GOVERNMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 10H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§10H-</u> <u>Reports.</u> <u>The Native Hawaiian roll commission,</u>
5	in cooperation with the office of Hawaiian affairs, shall submit
6	an annual report to the governor and the legislature no later
7	than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session,
8	beginning with the regular session of 2014, on the status of the
9	preparation of a roll of qualified Native Hawaiians,
10	expenditures related to the responsibilities of the Native
11	Hawaiian roll commission, and any concerns or recommendations as
12	deemed appropriate by the Native Hawaiian roll commission."
13	SECTION 2. Section 10H-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
15	"(a) There is established a five-member Native Hawaiian
16	roll commission within the office of Hawaiian affairs for
17	administrative purposes only. The Native Hawaiian roll
18	commission shall be responsible for:

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1	(1)	Preparing	and maintaining a <u>confidential</u> roll of	
2		qualified	Native Hawaiians;	
3	(2)	Certifyin	g that the individuals on the roll of	
4		qualified	Native Hawaiians meet the definition of

13			aboriginal peoples who, prior to 1778,

18			native people of Hawaii and who was eligible	
19			in 1921 for the programs authorized by the	
20			Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, or a	
21			direct lineal descendant of that individual;

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1	<u>(i</u>	ii) An individual who meets the ancestry
2		requirements of Kamehameha Schools or of the
3		Hawaiian registry program of the office of
4		Hawaiian affairs;
5	(B)	Has maintained a significant cultural, social, or
6		civic connection to the Native Hawaiian community
7		and wishes to participate in the organization of
8		the Native Hawaiian governing entity; [and]
9	(C)	Is eighteen years of age or older; <u>and</u>
10	<u>(D)</u>	Is a permanent resident of the State of Hawaii or
11		a registered voter in the State of Hawaii; and
12	(3) Recei	ving and maintaining documents that verify
13	ances	try; cultural, social, or civic connection to the
14	Nativ	e Hawaiian community; and age from individuals
15	seeki	ng to be included in the roll of qualified Native
16	Hawai	ians. Notwithstanding any other law to the
17	contra	ary, these verification documents shall be
18	confi	dential."
19	SECTION 3.	Section 10H-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20	amended by amen	ding subsection (b) to read as follows:
21	"(b) The j	publication of the initial and updated rolls
22	shall serve as	the basis for the eligibility of qualified Native
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1	Hawaiians whose names are listed on the rolls to participate in			
2	the organization of the Native Hawaiian governing entity $[-]_{j}$			
3	provided that prior to the publication of a participant's name			
4	on the public roll, an authorization for the release of			
5	information shall be signed by the participant and the Native			
6	Hawaiian roll commission."			
7	SECTION 4. Act 195, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011, is			
8	amended by repealing section 3.			
9	["SECTION 3. The Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920,			
10	shall be amended subject to approval by the United States			
11	Congress, if necessary, to accomplish the purposes set forth in			
12	this Act in a manner that is expeditious, timely, and consistent			
13	with the current needs and requirements of the Native Hawaiian			
14	people and the current beneficiaries of the Hawaiian Homes			
15	Commission Act, 1920."]			
16	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed			
17	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.			
18	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Native Hawaiians; Recognition; Native Hawaiian Roll Commission

Description:

Requires annual reports from the Native Hawaiian Roll Commission. Amends the definition of "qualified Native Hawaiian" to include individuals who meet certain expanded ancestry requirements and require permanent residency or voter registration in the State. Clarifies that the roll of qualified Native Hawaiians is confidential and requires an authorization for the release of information. Repeals directive to amend the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act.
