A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TAXATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 6K-9.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) There is created in the state treasury a trust fund
4 to be designated as the Kaho'olawe rehabilitation trust fund to
5 be administered by the department with the prior approval of the
6 commission. Subject to Public Law 103-139, and this chapter:

- 7 (1) All moneys received from the federal government for
 8 the rehabilitation and environmental restoration of
 9 the island of Kaho'olawe or other purposes consistent
 10 with this chapter;
- 11 (2) Any moneys appropriated by the legislature to the12 trust fund;
- 13 (3) The appropriate percentage identified under section
 14 247-7 of all taxes imposed and collected under chapter
 15 247;
- 16 [(3)] (4) Any moneys received from grants, donations, or 17 the proceeds from contributions; and



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[(4)] (5) The interest or return on investments earned from 1 2 moneys in the trust fund, 3 shall be deposited in the trust fund and shall be used to 4 fulfill the purposes of this chapter." 5 SECTION 2. Section 247-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 amended to read as follows: 7 "§247-7 Disposition of taxes. All taxes collected under this chapter shall be paid into the state treasury to the credit 8 9 of the general fund of the State, to be used and expended for the purposes for which the general fund was created and exists 10 by law; provided that of the taxes collected each fiscal year: 11 12 Ten per cent shall be paid into the land conservation (1) 13 fund established pursuant to section 173A-5; (2) Twenty-five per cent from July 1, 2009, until June 30, 14 15 2012, and thirty per cent in each fiscal year thereafter shall be paid into the rental housing trust 16 fund established by section 201H-202; [and] 17 18 Twenty per cent from July 1, 2009, until June 30, (3) 19 2012, and twenty-five per cent in each fiscal year thereafter shall be paid into the natural area reserve 20 fund established by section 195-9; provided that the 21 22 funds paid into the natural area reserve fund shall be



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annually disbursed by the department of land and 1 2 natural resources in the following priority: 3 To natural area partnership and forest (A) stewardship programs after joint consultation 4 5 with the forest stewardship committee and the 6 natural area reserves system commission; 7 Projects undertaken in accordance with watershed (B) 8 management plans pursuant to section 171-58 or watershed management plans negotiated with 9 10 private landowners, and management of the natural area reserves system pursuant to section 195-3; 11 12 and The youth conservation corps established under (C) 13 14 chapter 193[-];15 (4) Three per cent shall be paid into the Kaho'olawe rehabilitation trust fund established pursuant to 16 17 section 6K-9.5; and (5) Two per cent shall be paid into the bureau of 18 19 conveyances special fund established pursuant to 20 section 502-8." SECTION 3. Section 502-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 21

22 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
