## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE CAPITOL.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the facilities and 2 grounds of the Hawaii state capitol hold a unique and special place in the hearts of the citizens of this State. Known as one 3 of the most publicly accessible state capitols in the nation, 4 5 its unique, welcoming architecture symbolizes Hawaii's spirit of 6 aloha and island community and is the place where the State's 7 constitutionally-established democratic process is exercised. 8 In recognition of the historic significance of the Hawaii 9 state capitol and the democratic processes that often 10 necessitate extended hours of access to and operation of the 11 capitol building, the legislature finds that a separate 12 financing and governance structure should be established to 13 ensure that the facilities and grounds of the Hawaii state 14 capitol are secure, properly maintained, and operated in a 15 manner that meets the needs and expectations of the general 16 public.

1	The purpose of this Act is to establish a state capitol
2	management committee to oversee the financing and governance of
3	the state capitol and its grounds and facilities.
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
5	by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
6	designated and to read as follows:
7	"S6E- State capitol; state capitol management committee;
8	established; oversight and management; powers and duties. (a)
9	The oversight and management of the state capitol and its
10	grounds and facilities shall be vested in the state capitol
11	management committee established pursuant to this section.
12	(b) There is established the state capitol management
13	committee, which shall be composed of the following members or
14	their respective designees:
15	(1) The governor's chief of staff;
16	(2) The comptroller;
17	(3) The director of public safety;
18	(4) Two members of the senate as appointed by the
19	<pre>president of the senate;</pre>
20	(5) Two members of the house of representatives as
21	appointed by the speaker of the house of
22	representatives;

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1	(6) A registative officer of the senate appointed by the			
2	president of the senate; and			
3	(7) A legislative officer of the house of representatives			
4	appointed by the speaker of the house of			
5	representatives;			
6	provided that for members appointed pursuant to paragraphs (6)			
7	and (7), "legislative officer" shall have the same meaning as			
8	that term is defined in section 88-21.			
9	The chairperson of the state capitol management committee			
10	shall be elected by the committee members. The department of			
11	accounting and general services shall provide administrative			
12	support to the state capitol management committee; provided tha			
13	the committee shall also receive fiscal analysis support from			
14	the department of budget and finance as the committee deems			
15	appropriate.			
16	(c) The state capitol management committee shall meet at			
17	times and places as specified by a call of the chairperson or a			
18	majority of the committee; provided that the committee shall			
19	meet not less than four times per calendar year. The state			
20	capitol management committee shall prescribe rules, which shall			
21	not be subject to chapter 91, for its own management and			
22	governance. Five members of the committee shall constitute a			
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1	quorum, and a quorum may exercise all the power and authority
2	conferred on the committee.
3	(d) When a vacancy occurs in the membership of the state
4	capitol management committee, the respective appointing
5	authority shall fill the vacancy within fourteen days.
6	(e) Members of the state capitol management committee
7	shall serve without pay, but shall be reimbursed for their
8	actual and necessary expenses, including travel expenses,
9	ncurred in carrying out their duties.
10	(f) The state capitol management committee shall:
11	(1) Approve all policies and procedures relating to the
12	general operation and management of the state capitol
13	and its grounds and facilities, including parking,
14	building access, building operation hours, and genera
15	security policies;
16	(2) Develop and recommend to the legislature capital
17	improvement, programmatic, and operational priorities
18	that require fiscal resources to maintain and enhance
19	the appearance and operation of the state capitol and
20	its grounds and facilities;
21	(3) Review and authorize the repair and maintenance
22	schedule for the state capitol, its grounds and

1		facilities, and any other capital improvement projects	
2		relating to the upkeep, renovation, restoration, use,	
3		and maintenance of the state capitol and its grounds	
4		and facilities; and	
5	(4)	Review and authorize, but not execute, the expenditure	
6		of any moneys appropriated to and allocated by the	
7		department of budget and finance, accounting and	
8		general services, or public safety for the state	
9		capitol and its grounds and facilities."	
10	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general	
11	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much		
12	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the		
13	establishment and operation of the state capitol management		
14	committee pursuant to this Act.		
15	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of	
16	accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.		
17	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.		
18	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
