A BILL FOR AN ACT

ESTABLISHING THE FARM-TO-TABLE TASK FORCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that farm-to-table 2 initiatives foster agricultural self-sustainability. In 3 addition, farm-to-table programs can benefit our State by 4 connecting local agricultural producers with local consumers and 5 purchasers, supporting our local agricultural industry, 6 mitigating adverse environmental impacts caused by transporting 7 food over long distances, and instilling healthy eating habits. The legislature also finds that farm-to-table initiatives are in 8 9 line with the goals of Hawaii's long-term sustainability plan. 10 Furthermore, healthy eating and good nutrition is important 11 to all residents, especially children. Well-nourished children 12 perform better in school and have higher academic achievement. 13 Increasing children's knowledge of local agriculture and 14 improving their eating habits would improve their health and 15 academic performance, potentially reduce long-term health care 16 costs, and help them lead better lives.

17 The purpose of this Act is to establish the Farm-to-Table
