### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The importance of agriculture to the State is SECTION 1. 2 reflected in article XI, section 3 of the Hawaii state constitution. The legislature finds that it is important to 3 4 identify areas of improvement for agricultural practices in 5 order to strengthen the safety and security of the State's 6 agriculture. Recent cases of foodborne illnesses, such as the 7 emergence of the rat lungworm nematode on the island of Hawaii, 8 illustrate the need to understand the innumerable details 9 involved in food production and in implementing practices that 10 ensure food safety.

11 On January 4, 2011, President Obama signed into law the 12 Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA). The FSMA is considered to 13 be the most sweeping reform of food safety laws in over seventy 14 years. It aims to ensure the U.S. food supply is safe by 15 shifting the focus from responding to contamination to 16 preventing it. The Food and Drug Administration released two of 17 the five major regulations tied to the FSMA on January 4, 2013.



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1 These regulations regulate food safety protocols for produce and 2 manufactured foods. 3 The purpose of this Act is to convene a task force in the 4 department of agriculture to study and recommend to the 5 legislature: The effects of the FSMA on the State; 6 (1)7 (2) Methods to prepare the State for FSMA implementation 8 and compliance; and 9 (3) Additional areas of improvement in agricultural 10 practices to strengthen the safety and security of the State's agriculture. 11 12 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a food safety task 13 force within the department of agriculture consisting of the 14 following members: 15 The chairperson of the board of agriculture, who shall (1)16 serve as the chairperson of the task force; 17 (2) One additional member representing the department of 18 agriculture; 19 (3) One member representing the department of health; 20 (4) One member representing the College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources of the University of 21 22 Hawaii;

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1 (4) Any other objective deemed necessary by the 2 chairperson of the board of agriculture or the task 3 force. A simple majority of the members of the task force 4 (d) 5 shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and 6 all actions of the task force shall require the affirmative vote 7 of a majority of the members present. 8 (e) Members of the task force shall serve without 9 compensation, and all necessary expenses, including travel 10 expenses, shall be paid by the agency, organization, or 11 department to which the member belongs. No member shall be made 12 subject to chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely because 13 of that member's participation as a member of the task force. 14 (f) The task force shall submit a written report of findings and recommendations, including any necessary proposed 15 16 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior 17 to the convening of the regular session of 2014. 18 This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
