A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMED VOTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that as part of the 2 ratification process for any amendment to the Hawaii state 3 constitution or the respective counties' charters, each proposed 4 amendment shall appear on a state or county ballot during an 5 election. As the ratification requirement gives voters the 6 chance to accept or reject the proposed amendments, it acts as a 7 mechanism to prevent elected officials from changing core 8 foundational documents on a whim and makes the public a crucial 9 part of the amendment process.

10 The legislature also finds, however, that the general 11 voting public may not fully understand what the proposed 12 amendments intend to accomplish, especially if they are 13 particularly complex or technical. Further, members of the 14 public may not be familiar enough with the issues underlying the 15 proposed amendments to take a position on the wisdom of the 16 amendments.

7 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
8 of this Act are severable.

9 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
10 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
