RELATING TO INFORMATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that current technologies
2	can facilitate increased transparency about governmental
3	activities by allowing the general public to access state
4	financial information online. The purpose of this Act is to
5	require the department of accounting and general services to
6	develop and post periodically updated information on the
7	Internet that shows:
8	(1) Revenues, expenditures, and cash on hand in sufficient
9	detail to allow an accurate assessment of the fiscal
10	condition and the performance of the State;
11	(2) Details regarding the progression of capital
12	improvement projects toward completion. ,
13	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
14	adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read
15	as follows:
16	"S - Online reporting; periodic updates. (a) The
17	department of accounting and general services, in accordance
18	with this section, shall establish, implement, and maintain a

1	single se	archable website, accessible by the public at no cost
2	to users.	
3	(b)	One destination within the website shall contain the
4	following	information, which shall, at a minimum, be updated on
5	a quarter	ly basis:
6	<u>(1)</u>	A chart of accounts for all general funds, special
7		funds, federal funds, interdepartmental transfers,
8		revolving funds, and other funds into which moneys are
9		appropriated for the operating budget, incomplete
10		capital improvement projects, and capital improvement
11		projects completed less than five years prior to the
12		date of the website's most recent update;
13	(2)	The amounts and dates of appropriations, allocations,
14		expenditures, lapses, transfers of funds, means of
15		financing, and Acts under which the amounts were
16		appropriated; and
17	<u>(3)</u>	A summary of income received, expenditures made,
18		balances remaining, costs incurred but not yet
19	•	expended, cash on hand, and any related information
20		that may assist the legislature and members of the
21		public in understanding the fiscal condition of the
