A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAII GOOD AGRICULTURAL PRACTICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Hawaii's farms and farmers reflect the heritage
and diversity of many cultures and people. They are the
cornerstones of the State's goals for food security,
sustainability, and self-sufficiency and are essential for
producing local food for local consumption.

6 The number of small farms in Hawaii has grown substantially 7 during the last ten years, reflecting a changing agricultural 8 model from plantations to smaller farms with diverse cropping 9 and marketing systems that create new local food sources and 10 significantly increased employment. There is also a renewed 11 interest in school gardens that allow children to eat and enjoy 12 the food they grow, contribute to their school cafeteria system, 13 and learn economic, science, and cultural lessons through an 14 agriculture-based curriculum.

15 These trends necessitate the development of Hawaii good 16 agricultural practices comprising science-based standards to 17 reduce the potential for food product contamination on farms. 18 These guidelines will provide support for good farm practices HB HMS 2013-1115

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regarding field management, proper hygiene, water quality for
irrigation and produce rinse, use of agricultural chemicals, and
use of animal manure.

At the national level, the Food Safety Modernization Act of 2011 authorizes the federal Food and Drug Administration to develop contaminant-specific controls and science-based standards for preventing food borne illnesses and encourages states to establish similar intrastate criteria for the safe production, distribution, and consumer handling of food.

10 The Hawaii state constitution mandates the preservation and 11 protection of agricultural resources. However, the department 12 of agriculture's current use of third party food safety 13 certification audit systems is costly and impractical for many 14 of Hawaii's farmers. The current food safety certification 15 procedure has reduced farmers' access to local markets, thereby 16 reducing local consumers' access to local produce and possibly 17 discouraging the development of farms that could create food 18 sustainability for the State. It also prevents children from 19 having reasonable access to school gardens and undermines 20 government programs that encourage food self-sufficiency and 21 economic development.



1	The purpose of this Act is to establish a Hawaii good		
2	agricultural practices program for farms growing local		
3	agricultural food products.		
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 147, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
5	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
6	and to read as follows:		
7	" <u>§147-</u> <u>Hawaii good agricultural practices program.</u> (a)		
8	There is established the Hawaii good agricultural practices		
9	program to be administered by the department of agriculture.		
10	The purpose of the program is to develop and support good		
11	agricultural practices for Hawaii farms growing agricultural		
12	food products.		
13	(b) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary,		
14	the Hawaii good agricultural practices program shall:		
15	(1) Develop good agricultural practices consisting of		
16	contaminant-specific controls and science-based		
17	standards that reasonably reduce the potential for on-		
18	farm food borne illness transmission and include		
19	specific considerations and methodologies for farm		
20	sizes, practices, techniques, materials, and crops;		



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1	(2)	Develop and implement programs to educate and train	
2		Hawaii farmers to implement good agricultural	
3		practices in a cost-effective and efficient manner;	
4	<u>(3)</u>	Provide procedures for voluntary verification of on-	
5		farm implementation of good agricultural practices and	
6		subsequent issuance of state compliance certification;	
7		and	
8	(4)	Develop a consumer information program for publication	
9		and broadcast to teach good home practices for the	
10		treatment and handling of fresh and processed	
11		agricultural food products.	
12	<u>(c)</u>	The department shall consult as necessary with the	
13	department of health, the University of Hawaii college of		
14	tropical	agriculture and human resources, and other state and	
15	federal agencies to develop and implement the Hawaii good		
16	agricultural practices program.		
17	(d) The department may adopt rules under chapter 91 to		
18	facilitate the implementation of this section."		
19	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
20	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much		
21	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and	
22	\$	or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year

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2014-2015 for the implementation of the Hawaii good agricultural
practices program.

3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department4 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

6 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
