Interconnection Study Fees; Photovoltaic Systems Ten or Fewer Kilowatt Output; Interconnection Approval

Description:

Prohibits utilities from charging consumers a fee for interconnection studies. Requires approval of interconnection for photovoltaic systems with rated output of ten or fewer kilowatts, after necessary reviews or studies, if the total existing or planned cumulative photovolatic kilowatt output is at or below seventy-five per cent of the circuit's daily minimum load.
