RELATING TO OCEAN RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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| 1 | SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii State |
| 2 | Constitution establishes clear fiduciary duties with respect to |
| 3 | Hawaii's natural resources, which are held and maintained in |
| 4 | trust on behalf of the people of the State. In order to explore |
| 5 | methods to better fulfill these public trust duties and |
| 6 | responsibilities, the legislature established the West Hawaii |
| 7 | regional fishery management area in 1998. The West Hawaii |
| 8 | regional fishery management area is differentiated from other |
| 9 | nearshore marine managed areas by the statutory ability of the |
| 10 | department of land and natural resources to regulate fisheries |
| 11 | in West Hawaii specifically, with the guidance and advice of the |
| 12 | West Hawaii Fisheries Council. |
| 13 | The legislature also finds that the West Hawaii regional |
| 14 | fishery management area has proven to be a moderate and notable |
| 15 | success, particularly in fulfilling its purposes of improving |

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- 1 legislature further finds that this success continues to be
- 2 threatened by the difficulties of resource monitoring, and of
- 3 ensuring compliance with West Hawaii regulations. For example,
- 4 reported poaching activities in West Hawaii's fish replenishment
- 5 areas indicate that ongoing illegal actions and adverse impacts
- 6 to fisheries ecosystems and their sustainability pose an
- 7 increasing threat of user conflicts, and potentially confound
- 8 scientific research and monitoring projects.
- 9 In addition, the lack of reliable data regarding fishing
- 10 pressure and extraction levels in West Hawaii generally further
- 11 undermines the State's capacity to monitor and enhance West
- 12 Hawaii's nearshore fishery resources. Unfortunately, the
- 13 limited capacity of resources enforcement personnel, and their
- 14 lack of inspection authority absent evidence establishing
- 15 probable cause, prevents the department from effectively
- 16 monitoring compliance with resource regulations to ensure the
- 17 continued success of the West Hawaii regional fishery management
- 18 area.
- 19 Accordingly, the legislature finds that probable cause
- 20 requirements render criminal investigation and enforcement an
- 21 inappropriate and insufficient tool for resource compliance
- 22 monitoring within the West Hawaii regional fishery management



- 1 area. The legislature also finds that the State has an
- 2 important constitutional interest in conserving and managing the
- 3 State's aquatic resources. Given the necessity of adequate
- 4 inspection authority to effectively monitor fishery activities,
- 5 and the lowered expectation of privacy for permitted or licensed
- 6 extraction activities relating to the aquatic resources of the
- 7 State, the legislature further finds that an administrative
- 8 inspection scheme allowing inspections without probable cause or
- 9 criminal liability may be necessary to fulfill the State's
- 10 constitutional duties.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to provide enhanced tools to
- 12 better ensure compliance and monitoring of direct extraction
- 13 activities within West Hawaii by establishing administrative
- 14 inspection authority for vessels and catch containers of
- 15 permitted fishers within the waters of West Hawaii.
- 16 SECTION 2. Chapter 188F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 18 and to read as follows:
- 19 "\$188F- Administrative inspection of commercial fishers
- 20 and wholesalers within the West Hawaii regional fishery
- 21 management area. (a) Subject to subsection (b), any agent of
- 22 the department upon whom the board has conferred police powers,
