A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MANDATORY REPORTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 412:3-114.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
2	is amended to read as follows:
3	"[+]§412:3-114.5[+] Mandatory reporting of suspected
4	financial abuse of an elder. (a) A financial institution shall
5	report suspected financial abuse that is directed towards,
6	targets, or is committed against an elder to the appropriate
7	police department [of human services] and may report suspected
8	financial abuse to the department if:
9	(1) In connection with providing financial services to the
10	elder, the officer or employee of a financial
11	institution:
12	(A) Has direct contact with the elder; or
13	(B) Reviews or approves the elder's financial
14	documents, records, or transactions; and
15	(2) The officer or employee, within the scope of
16	employment or professional practice:



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1		(A)	Observes or has knowledge of an incident the
2			officer or employee believes in good faith
3			appears to be financial abuse; or
4		(B)	In the case of officers or employers who do not
5			have direct contact with the elder, has a good
6			faith suspicion that financial abuse has occurred
7			or may be occurring, based solely on the
8			information present at the time of reviewing or
9			approving the document, record, or transaction.
10	(b)	Susp	ected financial abuse [shall] <u>:</u>
11		(1)	Shall be reported immediately [to the department]
12			or as soon as practicably possible to the
13			appropriate police department by telephone and by
14			[written report sent within five business days.]
15			electronic communication; and
16		(2)	Shall be reported within two business days to the
17			appropriate police department by written report.
18	(c)	[Upo i	n notification by a financial institution of
19	suspected	fina	ncial abuse, the department, in a timely manner,
20	shall deta	ermin	e whether the department has jurisdiction over the
21	elder invo	əlved	; and if not, shall notify the financial
22	institutio	ən, wi	hich shall then notify the proper local law



1	enforcement agency immediately by telephone and forward the
2	written report to the agency within three business days. A
3	financial institution shall not be liable for failing to report
4	suspected financial abuse to a local law enforcement agency in
5	cases in which the department fails to notify the institution of
6	the department's lack of jurisdiction.] The department shall
7	inform the appropriate police department of all reports received
8	by the department regarding a case of financial abuse; provided
9	that the name of the person who reported the case of financial
10	abuse shall be released to the police department pursuant only
11	to court order or the person's consent.
12	(d) The department shall inform the appropriate police
13	department or office of the prosecuting attorney of any relevant
14	information concerning a case of financial abuse when the
15	information is requested by the police department or office of
16	the prosecuting attorney for the investigation or prosecution of
17	that case; provided that the name of the person who reported the
18	case of financial abuse shall be released to the police
19	department or office of the prosecuting attorney pursuant only
20	to court order or the person's consent.
21	[(d)] <u>(e)</u> Notwithstanding any other state law to the

22 contrary, including but not limited to laws concerning



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1	confidentiality, any person, including the financial
2	institution, who:
3	(1) Participates in the making of a report pursuant to
4	this section; and
5	(2) Believes, in good faith, that the action is warranted
6	by facts known to that person,
7	shall have immunity from any liability, civil or criminal, that
8	might be otherwise incurred or imposed by or as a result of the
9	making of the report. Any person making the report shall have
10	the same immunity with respect to participation in any judicial
11	proceeding resulting from the report.
12	[(e)] <u>(f)</u> For the purposes of this section:
13	"Department" means the department of human services.
14	"Elder" means a person who is sixty-two years of age or
15	older.
16	"Financial abuse" means financial abuse or economic
17	exploitation."
18	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
