A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNLAWFUL CHOP SHOP ACTIVITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a chop shop is
2	street vernacular for a location where stolen motor vehicles or
3	motor vehicle parts are taken to be altered to conceal their
4	true identity. Chop shop activity may include theft of motor
5	vehicles and motor vehicle parts, defacing vehicle
6	identification numbers, re-stamping false vehicle identification
7	numbers into stolen vehicles, and the re-sale of these stolen
8	vehicles to unsuspecting innocent buyers.
9	The purpose of this Act is to establish a criminal offense
10	of unlawful chop shop activity.
11	SECTION 2. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
13	to read as follows:
