A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes that trespassing on
- 2 agricultural land is a frequent occurrence in the State.
- 3 Agricultural crimes, including theft of landowners' crops,
- 4 livestock, machinery, and other property, are often committed by
- 5 trespassers. Trespassers increase landowners' vulnerability to
- 6 liability from deaths or injuries that occur on landowners'
- 7 property. Trespassers are also known to cut fences, cut gate
- 8 chains, and leave gates open, which result in substantial costs
- 9 to landowners in money and time.
- 10 In 2011, in response to growing concerns over agricultural
- 11 trespass in the State, Act 208, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011, was
- 12 enacted, among other things, to protect owners of more than four
- 13 acres of agricultural land by limiting their civil liability for
- 14 injury, death, loss, or damages suffered by a trespasser on the
- 15 land. The legislature finds that smaller owners of agricultural
- 16 lands of four acres or less are also vulnerable to the risks and
- 17 costs associated with trespassers.

1	The purpose of this Act is to extend the limited liability		
2	protection against actions by trespassers to owners of		
3	agricultural lands that are four acres or less, if the farming		
4	operation produces annual taxable revenues in excess of		
5	\$100,000.		
6	SECTION 2. Section 663-10.99, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
7	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:		
8	"(b) For purposes of this section, unless the context		
9	otherwise requires:		
10	"Agricultural land" means [any]:		
11	(1) Any land in excess of four acres used primarily for a		
12	farming operation, as defined in section 165-2[+		
13	provided that the term shall include], including land		
14	used for farm buildings [and], dwellings [and], roads,		
15	and irrigation infrastructure associated with the		
16	agricultural land[-]; or		
17	(2) Any land of four acres or less used primarily for a		
18	farming operation, as defined in section 165-2, that		
19	produces an annual taxable revenue in excess of		
20	\$100,000 from farming operations, including land used		
21	for farm buildings, roads, and irrigation		
22	infrastructure associated with the agricultural land.

4	"Owner" means the possessor of a fee interest, a tenant,

9	"Trespasser" means a person who enters or remains		
10	unlawfully on [the] agricultural land without the permission of

13	exclude the general public, or marked by a structure		
14	or barrier, including a cattle grid, cattle grate, or		
15	other obstacle used to secure livestock;		
16	(2) Have a sign or signs displayed on the land that are		
17	sufficient to give reasonable notice and that read [as		
18	follows]: "No Trespassing" or a substantially similar		
19	message; provided that the sign or signs shall consist		
20	of letters not less than two inches in height and		
21	shall be placed at reasonable intervals along the		
22	boundary line of the land and at roads and trails

2		clearly noticeable from outside the boundary line; or
3	(3)	At the time of entry, are fallow or have a visible
4		presence or evidence of livestock-raising, such as
5		cattle, horses, water troughs, shelters, or paddocks,

7		(A) Under cultivation;
8		(B) In the process of being harvested; or
9		(C) That has been harvested."
