A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MAKUA VALLEY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Ţ	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	MAKUA VALLEY RESERVE
6	§ -1 Administration of chapter. The Makua valley
7	reserve commission and the department of land and natural
8	resources shall administer this chapter.
9	§ -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
10	context otherwise requires:
11	"Commission" means the Makua valley reserve commission.
12	"Department" means the department of land and natural
13	resources.
14	"Valley reserve" means the area designated on the island of
15	Oahu as Makua valley, including the three ahupuaa of
16	Kahanahaiki, Makua, and Koiahi.

- 1 § -3 Reservation of uses. (a) The valley reserve shall
- 2 be used for the following purposes subject to cancellation,
- 3 termination, or terms of existing lease:
- 4 (1) Preservation and practice of all rights customarily
- 5 and traditionally exercised by Native Hawaiians for
- 6 cultural, spiritual, and subsistence purposes;
- 7 (2) Preservation and protection of the valley reserve's
- 8 archaeological, historical, and environmental
- 9 resources:
- 10 (3) Rehabilitation, revegetation, habitat restoration, and
- 11 preservation; and
- 12 (4) Education.
- 13 (b) The valley reserve shall be reserved in perpetuity for
- 14 the uses enumerated in subsection (a). Commercial uses shall be
- 15 strictly prohibited.
- 16 § -4 Powers and duties. The department and other
- 17 departments and agencies of the State shall be subject to the
- 18 oversight of the commission with regard to the control and
- 19 management of the valley reserve. Subject to section -6, the
- 20 department shall:
- 21 (1) Implement controls and permitted uses for the valley
- 22 reserve;

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1	(2)	Enforce this chapter; and
2	(3)	Provide administrative support to the commission.
3	S	-5 Commission. (a) There is established the Makua
4	valley re	serve commission to be placed within the department for
5	administr	ative purposes as provided in section 26-35. The
6	commissio	n shall consist of seven members to be appointed in the
7	manner an	d to serve for the terms provided in section 26-34;
8	provided	that:
9	. (1)	One member shall be a member of Malama Makua;
10	(2)	One member shall be a member of Hui Malama O Makua;
11	(3)	One member shall be a representative of families who
12		were evicted from the valley reserve or whose lands in
13		the valley reserve were condemned by the federal
14		government;
15	(4)	One member shall be appointed by the governor from a
16		list provided by the Waianae coast community;
17	(5)	One member shall be a trustee or representative of the
18		office of Hawaiian affairs;
19	(6)	One member shall be the chairperson of the board of
20		land and natural resources, or the chairperson's
21		designee; and

- (7) One member shall be appointed by the governor from a
 list provided by Native Hawaiian organizations.
- 3 (b) The governor shall appoint the chairperson from among
- 4 the members of the commission.
- 5 (c) The members of the commission shall serve without pay
- 6 but shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses,
- 7 including travel expenses, incurred in carrying out their
- 8 duties.
- 9 (d) Any action taken by the commission shall be approved
- 10 by a simple majority of its members. Four members shall
- 11 constitute a quorum.
- 12 (e) The commission, without regard to the requirements of
- 13 chapter 76, may hire employees, including an executive director,
- 14 necessary to carry out its duties.
- 15 § -6 Responsibilities and duties of the commission. The
- 16 general administration of the valley reserve shall rest with the
- 17 commission. In carrying out its duties and responsibilities,
- 18 the commission:
- 19 (1) Shall establish criteria, policies, and controls for
- 20 permissible uses within the valley reserve;
- 21 (2) Shall approve all contracts for services and rules
- 22 pertaining to the valley reserve;

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1	(3)	sharr provide advice to the governor, the department,
2		and other departments and agencies on any matter
3		relating to the valley reserve;
4	(4)	Shall provide advice to the office of planning and the
5		department of the attorney general on any matter
6		relating to the federal conveyance of the valley
7		reserve;
8	(5)	May enter into curator or stewardship agreements with
9		appropriate Hawaiian cultural and spiritual community
10		organizations for the perpetuation of Native Hawaiian
11		cultural, religious, and subsistence customs, beliefs,
12		and practices for the purposes stated in section -3;
13	(6)	Shall advise the board of land and natural resources
14		and the land use commission with regard to
15		dispositions and approvals pertaining to the valley
16		reserve;
17	(7)	Shall advise the city and county of Honolulu and its
18		agencies concerning coastal zone dispositions and
19		approvals pertaining to the valley reserve;
20	(8)	Shall advise the appropriate island burial council and
21		the department with regard to proper treatment of

1		burial sites and human skeletal remains found in the
2		valley reserve;
3	(9)	Shall adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 that
4		are necessary for the purposes of this chapter and
5		shall maintain a record of its proceedings and
6		actions; and
7	(10)	May delegate to the executive director or employees of
8		the commission, by formal commission action, such
9		power and authority vested in the commission by this
10		chapter as the commission deems reasonable and proper
11		for the effective administration of this chapter.
12	S	-7 Interim activities of the commission. Prior to the
13	return of	the valley reserve from the United States Army to the
14	State, th	e commission shall enter into discussions with the
15	United St	ates Army to:
16	(1)	Facilitate the expedient return of the valley reserve
17		upon the expiration of the United States Army's lease;
18	(2)	Ensure the clean-up of unexploded ordnance; and
19	(3)	Ensure the expansion of opportunities for cultural
20		access.
21	S	-8 Transfer. Upon the expiration of the existing
22	lease, th	e resources of the valley reserve shall be held in



- 1 trust as part of the public land trust; provided that the State
- 2 shall transfer management and control of the valley reserve to
- 3 the sovereign Native Hawaiian entity upon its recognition by the
- 4 United States and the State.
- 5 All terms, conditions, agreements, and laws affecting the
- 6 valley reserve, including any ongoing obligations relating to
- 7 the clean-up of the valley reserve, shall remain in effect
- 8 unless expressly terminated.
- 9 § -9 Makua valley rehabilitation trust fund. (a) There
- 10 is created in the state treasury a trust fund to be designated
- 11 as the Makua valley rehabilitation trust fund to be administered
- 12 by the department with the prior approval of the commission.
- 13 Subject to this chapter:
- 14 (1) All moneys received from the federal government for
- 15 the rehabilitation and environmental restoration of
- the valley reserve;
- 17 (2) Any moneys appropriated by the legislature to the
- 18 trust fund; and
- 19 (3) The interest or profit on investments earned from
- 20 moneys in the trust fund;
- 21 shall be deposited in the trust fund and shall be used to
- 22 fulfill the purposes of this chapter.

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- 1 (b) The commission may use moneys in the trust fund to
- 2 carry out the purposes of this chapter, including hiring
- 3 employees, specialists, and consultants necessary to complete
- 4 projects related to the purposes of this chapter.
- 5 (c) Moneys deposited into or appropriated to the trust
- 6 fund shall remain available until they are obligated or until
- 7 the trust fund is repealed.
- 8 (d) The trust fund shall be repealed on July 1, 2045. The
- 9 commission shall transfer to the general fund of the State, all
- 10 unexpended or unencumbered balances remaining in the trust fund
- 11 on June 30, 2045; provided that all unexpended or unencumbered
- 12 balances of federal moneys shall be disbursed in accordance with
- 13 applicable federal law.
- 14 § -10 Severability. If any provision of this chapter or
- 15 the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
- 16 invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or
- 17 applications of this chapter that can be given effect without
- 18 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
- 19 provisions of this chapter are severable."
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act shall not obstruct, deny, or revoke
- 21 any rights or privileges heretofore exercised by the United

- 1 States Army in its use of Makua valley throughout the term of
- 2 its lease.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
