RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 302A-251, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y amending subsection (f) to read as follows:
3	"(f)	For purposes of this section, "student instructional
4	hours" means [student]:	
5	(1)	Student learning time in elementary schools during
6		which students are engaged in learning activities.
, 7		including [regularly scheduled] regularly scheduled
8		instruction [and], project-based learning assignments,
9		technology-assisted learning, learning assessments
10		within the curriculum[, and does not include lunch,
11		recess, or passing time.], and all other activities in
12		which there is a related general learner outcome
13		attached to such time; and
14	(2)	Student learning time in secondary schools during
15		which students are engaged in learning activities,
16		including regularly scheduled instruction, project-
17		based learning assignments, technology-assisted
18		learning, and learning assessments within the



1	curriculum; provided that for purposes of determining
2	the adequacy of instructional time for secondary
3	schools, "student instructional hours" may include:
4	(A) Presentations by persons other than teachers;
5	(B) Directed study;
6	(C) Time spent in homeroom;
7	(D) Student advisory time;
8	(E) Statewide performance assessment; and
9	(F) All other activities in which there is a related
10	general learner outcome attached to such time."
11	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
