Student learning time in elementary schools during (1) 14 which students are engaged in learning activities 15 [including regularly-scheduled] that may include 16 regularly scheduled instruction [and], project-based 17 learning assignments, technology-assisted learning, 18 learning assessments within the curriculum[, and does 19 not include-lunch, recess, or passing time.], and all 20 other activities in which there is a related general 21 learner outcome attached to such time; and 22
