A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT MOTOR VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 105-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, prohibits persons from using, operating, or driving any motor 2 3 vehicle owned or controlled by the State or the counties, for 4 personal pleasure or personal use (as distinguished from 5 official or governmental service or use). Among other persons 6 and government agencies, the law excepts from this prohibition 7 the officers and employees of the board of water supply of the city and county of Honolulu when using a motor vehicle for a 8 9 personal purpose incidental to the person's service or work (but 10 not for pleasure). The legislature further finds that this 11 exception should extend to the boards of water supply of the 12 counties of Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui.

The purpose of this Act is to extend to all other county
boards of water supply, the exception the city and county of
honolulu board of water supply has to use a motor vehicle for a
personal purpose incidental to the person's service or work (but
not for pleasure).

2		county, who, in case of emergency, because of the
3		person's illness, or the person's incapacity caused by
4		accident while at work, or because of the illness of a
5		member of the person's immediate family including a
6		reciprocal beneficiary while the person is at work, is
7		conveyed in a motor vehicle to the person's place of
8		abode, or to a hospital or other place, but every such
9		use of such a motor vehicle shall be certified to by
10		the officer or by the head of the department,
11		commission, board, bureau, agency, or instrumentality
12	•	controlling or possessing the motor vehicle
13		immediately thereafter, and the certificate shall be
14		forthwith filed with the comptroller, in the case of
15		the State, or with the budget director, in the case of
16		a county; and
17	(7)	The assigned driver of a Van Go Hawaii vehicle or any
18		other state ridesharing program vehicle."
19	SECT	ION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
20	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
21	begun bef	ore its effective date.
