## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 349-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 3 The head of this office shall be known as the " (b) 4 director of the executive office on aging, hereinafter referred 5 to as director. The director shall have professional training 6 in the field of social work, education, public health, and other 7 related fields; extensive direct experience in programs or 8 services related to elders; and recent experience in a 9 supervisory, consultative, or administrative position. 10 director shall be nominated and appointed by the governor 11 without regard to chapters 76 and 89. Effective July 1, [2005,] 12 2013, the director shall be paid a salary set by the appointing 13 authority [that shall not exceed sixty-nine per cent of the 14 salary of the director of human resources development]. 15 director shall be included in any benefit program generally 16 applicable to the officers and employees of the State." 17 SECTION 2.
