A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FISHPONDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the repair of many
2	Hawaiian fishponds may require permits from the department of
3	land and natural resources, department of health, office of
4	planning, and federal and county governments.
5	The legislature further finds that the process of obtaining
6	a permit for the restoration of Hawaiian fishponds is time
7	consuming, complicated, confusing, and varies depending upon the
8	circumstances of the party applying for the permit. The
9	existing regulations and permit requirements preclude community
10	organizations and Native Hawaiian aquaculturalists from
11	repairing and maintaining Hawaiian fishponds.
12	The State has the ability to streamline the permit process
13	and promote interagency cooperation to facilitate restoration
14	and leasing of fishponds to cultural and familial descendants.
15	However, the State has not led a comprehensive initiative to
16	streamline the permit process for restoration of Hawaiian

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fishponds in more than thirty years.

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1 The restoration and reuse of loko i'a provide an opportunity to increase supplies of certain fish which will make Hawaii more 2 3 food-secure and increase sustainable economic development 4 opportunities for rural communities. 5 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of land and natural resources, department of health, and office of 6 7 planning in collaboration with community organizations and 8 Native Hawaiian aquaculturalists, to streamline the permitting 9 process and facilitate the restoration of Hawaiian fishponds. 10 The department of land and natural resources, SECTION 2. department of health, and office of planning, in collaboration 11 12 with community organizations and Native Hawaiian 13 aquaculturalists, shall streamline the permitting process and 14 facilitate the restoration of Hawaiian fishponds by 15 implementing: One master conservation district use application 16 (1)17 process that applies to all Hawaiian fishponds; (2) A coastal zone management program consistency 18 19 statement for Hawaiian fishponds; 20 (3) Water quality certification for Hawaiian fishponds;

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Ţ	(4) A general permit for Hawaiian fishponds that conforms
2	to the requirements for a Hawaiian fishpond pollution
3	discharge elimination system; and
4	(5) Administrative rules to be applied consistently
5	throughout the State.
6	The department of land and natural resources with input
7	from the department of health and office of planning shall
8	submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including
9	any proposed legislation for a streamlined permit process for
10	the restoration of Hawaiian fishponds, to the legislature no
11	later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
12	session of 2014.
13	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
