A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SOCIAL MEDIA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	TION 1. Chapter 378, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to Part I to be appropriately	
3	designated and to read as follows:	
4	"§378- Employer access to employee social media	
5	prohibite	d. (a) An employer shall not require or request an
6	employee	or applicant for employment to do any of the following:
7	(1)	Disclose a username or password for the purpose of
8		accessing the employee's or applicant's personal
9		social media;
10	(2)	Access the employee's or applicant's personal social
11		media in the presence of the employer; or
12	(3)	Divulge any personal social media, except as provided
13		in subsection (b).
14	<u>(b)</u>	Nothing in this section shall affect an employer's
15	existing	rights and obligations to request an employee to
16	divulge p	ersonal social media reasonably believed to be relevant
17	to an investigation of allegations of employee misconduct or	
18	employee	violation of applicable law; provided that the social
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- 1 media is used solely for purposes of that investigation or a
- 2 related proceeding.
- 3 (c) Nothing in this section shall preclude an employer
- 4 from requiring or requesting an employee to disclose a username
- 5 or password for the purpose of accessing an employer-issued
- 6 electronic device.
- 7 (d) An employer shall not discharge, discipline, threaten
- 8 to discharge or discipline, or retaliate against an employee or
- 9 applicant for not complying with a request or demand by the
- 10 employer that violates this section; provided that this section
- 11 shall not prohibit an employer from terminating or taking an
- 12 adverse action against an employee or applicant if otherwise
- 13 permitted by law.
- 14 (e) As used in this section, "social media" means an
- 15 electronic service or account or electronic content, including
- 16 videos, photographs, blogs, video blogs, podcasts, instant and
- 17 text messages, email, online services or accounts, or internet
- 18 website profiles or locations."
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 20 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 21 begun before its effective date.
- 22 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
