	error by a written certificate stating the reasons for

12	legal owner's current certificate of registration showing that
13	the person is the registered owner of the vehicle,
14	identification, and proof of motor vehicle insurance. If the
15	registered owner of the vehicle is not the legal owner of the
16	vehicle, the registered owner shall present to the carrier, the
17	registered owner's current certificate of registration,
18	identification, and proof of motor vehicle insurance. Duplicate
