## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OPEN CONTAINERS OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS IN PUBLIC HOUSING.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Current laws prohibiting the consumption of intoxicating liquor on any sidewalk or in any common area of a public housing project have been difficult to enforce due to the requirement that the arresting officer or a witness observe the defendant consuming the intoxicating liquor.

6 The purpose of this Act is to reduce the consumption of 7 alcohol on sidewalks and in common areas of state low-income 8 housing projects by prohibiting the possession or storage of any 9 open container of liquor in those areas, which will provide law 10 enforcement with broader authority to prevent public consumption 11 of alcohol.

SECTION 2. Chapter 281, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to part VII to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

15 "<u>§281-</u> Consuming or possessing intoxicating liquor while
16 on a sidewalk or common area of a housing project; prohibited.

17 (a) No person shall possess or store while on any sidewalk or

6 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
7 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
8 begun before its effective date.

9 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

11 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
