A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRIC PERSONAL ASSISTIVE MOBILITY DEVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that sidewalks are
- 2 becoming more dangerous because of the increasing prevalence of
- 3 electric vehicles on them. Use of certain types of vehicles on
- 4 sidewalks is already regulated in business districts and a
- 5 similar restriction is appropriate with regard to electric
- 6 vehicles.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the use of electric
- 8 personal assistive mobility devices on sidewalks in business
- 9 districts, except when being used by a police officer or person
- 10 with a disability.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 291C-134.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 "§291C-134.5 Electric personal assistive mobility devices;
- 14 restrictions. (a) Unless otherwise prohibited or regulated by
- 15 a county ordinance, an electric personal assistive mobility
- 16 device may be operated on sidewalks, at a speed no greater than
- 17 eight miles per hour, and bicycle paths of the State. An
- 18 electric personal assistive mobility device shall be prohibited



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- 1 on sidewalks in business districts, except when being used by a
- 2 police officer or person with a disability.
- 3 For the purposes of this subsection, "person with a
- 4 disability" has the same meaning as in section 291-51.
- 5 (b) The sale of consumer models of electric personal
- 6 assistive mobility devices in the State shall be limited to
- 7 those models operated by a key that can set the maximum forward
- 8 speed at no more than eight miles per hour.
- 9 [\(\(\frac{(b)}{c}\)] (c) An electric personal assistive mobility device
- 10 operator shall be sixteen years of age or older.
- 11 [(c)] (d) An electric personal assistive mobility device
- 12 operator on a sidewalk or bicycle path shall exercise due care
- 13 to avoid colliding with, and shall yield the right-of-way to,
- 14 persons traveling on foot and those using mobility aids.
- 15 [(d)] (e) An electric personal assistive mobility device
- 16 operator shall give an audible signal before overtaking and
- 17 passing any pedestrian.
- 18 [(e)] (f) An electric personal assistive mobility device
- 19 operator shall wear or equip the electric personal assistive
- 20 mobility device with reflectors and a headlamp when operating
- 21 between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before
- 22 sunrise.

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- 1 [(f)] (g) Any operator who operates an electric personal
- 2 assistive mobility device recklessly in disregard for the safety
- 3 of persons or property shall be assessed penalties as set forth
- 4 in section 291C-161."
- 5 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
