## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DISCLOSURE OF PUBLIC HEALTH STATISTICS RECORDS TO LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 338-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 2 The department shall not permit inspection of public 3 health statistics records, or issue a certified copy of any such 4 record or part thereof, unless it is satisfied that the 5 applicant has a direct and tangible interest in the record. The 6 following persons shall be considered to have a direct and 7 tangible interest in a public health statistics record: 8 The registrant; 9 (1)The spouse of the registrant; 10 (2) A parent of the registrant; (3) 11 A descendant of the registrant; 12 (4) A person having a common ancestor with the registrant; (5) 13 A legal guardian of the registrant; (6) 14 A person or agency acting on behalf of the registrant; 15 (7) A personal representative of the registrant's estate; (8) 16
