## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VITAL RECORDS FEES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 338, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding to part I a new section to be appropriately 2 3 designated and to read as follows: "§338- Fees for expedited copies or special services. 4 The department shall collect a \$50 fee for expedited certified 5 6 copy service for birth, death, and marriage records that are 7 already registered and accepted by the department. The 8 department shall keep an account of all fees collected and shall 9 deposit them to the vital statistics improvement special fund." SECTION 2. Section 338-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended to read as follows: 11 "§338-14 Fees for certified copies and searches; 12 transcripts or other statistical summaries of vital records for 13 National Center for Health Statistics; certified copies for 14 veterans and others; and corrections on vital statistics 15 16 certificates. (a) [The department of health shall establish 17 reasonable fees to be paid for certified copies of certificates; 18 provided that the] The department shall furnish, free of charge,

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1 a certified copy of any of the records, or a certification of 2 birth, to any veteran of the armed forces of the United States, 3 the veteran's wife, any member of the immediate family of a 4 veteran or the next of kin of a deceased veteran, when required 5 for use in connection with a claim based on service in the armed 6 forces of the United States. Subject to sections 338-16, 338-7 17, and 338-18, the National Center for Health Statistics may 8 obtain transcripts and statistical summaries on computer tapes 9 of certificates or, without payment of fees, certified copies; 10 provided the State is put to no expense in connection therewith. 11 A [reasonable] \$25 fee shall be charged for any correction

12 in the items on a vital statistics certificate initiated by the 13 registrant or the registrant's parent or representative if the 14 registrant is a minor.

(b) The department [may prescribe reasonable fees] shall
 <u>charge \$10</u> for searches of files and records not involving the
 issuance of certified copies.

(c) The department shall keep an account of all fees
collected and shall deposit them to the [general-fund of the
State] vital statistics improvement special fund, except as
provided in sections 321-1.3, 338-14.5, [338-14.6,]346-7.5, and
601-3.6.

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SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the vital
 statistics improvement special fund the sum of \$500,000 or so
 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 to
 offset administrative costs of activities related to the
 registration, processing, and issuance of vital records.
 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
 health for the purposes of this Act.

8 SECTION 6. This Act, upon its approval, shall take effect9 on July 1, 2013.

#### JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT:

Health

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO VITAL RECORDS FEES.

PURPOSE: To adjust and create fees charged to the public for copies of vital records to increase revenue to support vital statistics operations.

- MEANS: Add a new section to part I of chapter 338 and, amend sections 338-14 and 338-14.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- JUSTIFICATION: The Department of Health is permitted to charge reasonable fees for certain services, including processing copies for vital records. Many fees, such as those for certified copies or verifications of vital statistics records, have not kept pace with operating expenses. Other transactions, such for expedited services or corrections to records, are routinely requested and provided but have no additional resources to support them.
- GENERAL FUND: None, deposits to the General Fund remain unchanged.

OTHER FUNDS: Approximately \$1,650,000 in additional fees annually to the vital statistics improvement special fund.
