A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VITAL RECORDS FEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 338, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding to part I, a new section to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§338- Fees for expedited copies or special services.
5	The department of health shall collect a fee of \$ for
6	expedited certified copy service for birth, death, and marriage
7	records that are already registered and accepted by the
8	department. The department of health shall keep an account of
9	all fees collected and shall deposit the funds collected into
10	the vital statistics improvement special fund."
11	SECTION 2. Section 338-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended to read as follows:
13	"§338-14 Fees for certified copies and searches;
14	transcripts or other statistical summaries of vital records for
15	National Center for Health Statistics; certified copies for
16	veterans and others; and corrections on vital statistics
17	certificates. (a) The department of health [shall establish
18	reasonable fees to be paid for certified copies of certificates;
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1 provided that the department] shall furnish, free of charge, a 2 certified copy of any of the records, or a certification of 3 birth, to any veteran of the armed forces of the United States, the veteran's wife, any member of the immediate family of a 4 5 veteran or the next of kin of a deceased veteran, when required 6 for use in connection with a claim based on service in the armed 7 forces of the United States. Subject to sections 338-16, 338-8 17, and 338-18, the National Center for Health Statistics may 9 obtain transcripts and statistical summaries on computer tapes 10 of certificates or, without payment of fees, certified copies; 11 provided the State is put to no expense in connection therewith.

A [reasonable] fee of \$ shall be charged for any
correction in the items on a vital statistics certificate
initiated by the registrant or the registrant's parent or
representative if the registrant is a minor.

16 (b) The department <u>of health</u> [may prescribe reasonable
17 fees] shall charge a fee of \$ for searches of files and
18 records not involving the issuance of certified copies.

(c) The department <u>of health</u> shall keep an account of all
fees collected and shall deposit them to the [general fund of
the State] vital statistics improvement special fund, except as

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1 provided in sections 321-1.3, 338-14.5, [338-14.6,]346-7.5, and 2 601-3.6.

3	(d) [Any fee established by the department pursuant to			
4	this section shall be adopted in accordance with chapter 91. In			
5	establishing a fee, the amount shall be sufficient to cover the			
6	expenses involved in searching for, cost of a copy of, or			
7	correction of the certificate, file, or record, as the case may			
8	be. The department may raise the fees up to ten per cent per			
9	year without being subject to the provisions of chapter 91.] The			
10	fees shall be used to offset the administrative costs of			
11	activities related to the registration, processing, and issuance			
12	of vital records."			
13	SECTION 3. Section 338-14.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
14	amended to read as follows:			
15	"§338-14.5 Copies of certificate; fees. The fees for			
16	certified copies of birth, marriage, divorce, or death			
17	certificates issued by the department of health shall consist of			
18	[\$10] $$$ for the first copy issued and $[$4]$ $$$ for each copy			
19	issued thereafter. These fees shall be collected for each			
20	single request for certified copies. All fees received for the			
21	issuance of certified copies of birth, marriage, divorce, or			
22	death certificates shall be remitted to the director of health.			
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1	Upon the :	receipt of remittances under this section, the director
2	of health	shall deposit:
3	(1)	\$1 for each certified copy to the credit of the spouse
4		and child abuse special account established under
5		section 346-7.5;
6	(2)	\$1 for each certified copy to the credit of the spouse
7		and child abuse special account established under
8		section 601-3.6;
9	(3)	\$1 for each certified copy to the credit of the
10		domestic violence and sexual assault special fund
11		established under section 321-1.3;
12	(4)	[\$] for $[each]$ the first certified copy to the
13		credit of the vital statistics improvement special
14		fund established under section 338-14.6; [and]
15	(5)	[The remainder of the fee for each certified copy to
16		the credit of the state general fund.] <u>\$</u> for each
17		subsequent certified copy to the credit of the vital
18		statistics improvement special fund established under
19		section 338-14.6; and
20	(6)	\$ for the first certified copy to the credit of the
21		state general fund."



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1 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the vital 2 statistics improvement special fund the sum of \$ or so 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 to offset administrative costs of activities related to the 4 5 registration, processing, and issuance of vital records. 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 7 health for the purposes of this Act. 8 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 10 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
