A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OBESITY PREVENTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

2	SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
3	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
4	and to read as follows:		
5	"§321- Hawaii interagency obesity prevention council,		
6	established. (a) There is established within the department of		
7	health for administrative purposes, the Hawaii interagency		
8	obesity prevention council, which shall be an advisory board		
9	exempt from section 26-34.		
10	(b) The Hawaii interagency obesity prevention council		
11	shall be responsible for:		
12	(1) Formulating and advising the governor on the		
13	implementation of a unified ten-year statewide plan to		
14	address child and adult obesity in Hawaii;		
15	(2) Promoting collaboration among public agencies and		
16	private stakeholders to lower obesity rates in the		
17	State;		

1	(3)	Monitoring the progress of the state obesity
2		prevention strategic plan;
3	(4)	Providing recommendations to state agencies, the
4		legislature, and the private sector on improving the
5		quality, availability, and coordination of obesity
6,		prevention policies and activities;
7	<u>(5)</u>	Developing specific strategies to address social
8		determinants of health as they relate to obesity
9		prevention; and
10	<u>(6)</u>	Activating, coordinating, and maintaining responsive
11		action among the public, business, and educational
12		communities to become part of an obesity prevention
13		strategy.
14	<u>(c)</u>	The state obesity prevention strategic plan shall be
15	in writin	g and shall be a public document.
16	<u>(d)</u>	The council shall consist of at least the following
17	members o	r the member's designee:
18	<u>(1)</u>	The director of health who shall serve as chair;
19	(2)	The director of human services;
20	<u>(3)</u>	The superintendent of education;
21	(4)	A representative from the University of Hawaii John A.
22		Burns school of medicine;

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1	<u>(5)</u>	One member of the house of representatives to be		
2		appointed by the speaker of the house of		
3		representatives;		
4	(6)	One member of the senate to be appointed by the		
5		<pre>president of the senate;</pre>		
6	<u>(7)</u>	One member appointed by the governor; and		
7	<u>(8)</u>	Additional members as determined by the council.		
8	<u>(e)</u>	Council members shall be appointed without regard to		
9	section 2	6-34.		
10	<u>(f)</u>	Council members shall serve without compensation.		
11	<u>(g)</u>	The Hawaii interagency obesity prevention council		
12	shall meet quarterly, or more frequently as it deems necessary			
13	A majority of the members of the Hawaii interagency obesity			
14	prevention council shall constitute a quorum to do business and			
15	to valida	te any decision or act of the council."

22	including	but not limited to programs relating to diabetes,
