HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

HONORING AND ACHIEVING THE ESTABLISHED PUBLIC POLICIES AND OBJECTIVES FOR THE KAKAAKO COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT BY URGING THE HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY TO RESCIND APPROVAL FOR CERTAIN RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENTS AND BY IMPOSING A ONE-YEAR MORATORIUM ON PROJECT DEVELOPMENTS WITHIN THE DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT TO ADDRESS INFRASTRUCTURE IMPACTS AND OTHER MAJOR PUBLIC CONCERNS.

1 WHEREAS, through the enactment of chapter 206E, Hawaii
2 Revised Statutes, the Legislature created the Hawaii Community
3 Development Authority and designated community development
4 districts under the Authority's jurisdiction in order to develop
5 "communities which serve the highest needs and aspirations of
6 Hawaii's people;" and

8 WHEREAS, section 206E-33, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires 9 the Hawaii Community Development Authority to provide for the 10 high quality of life of residents within designated community 11 development districts by providing for an increased supply of 12 affordable housing within well-planned developments that meet 13 the community's needs; and

15 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Community Development Authority has not 16 consistently adhered to its own development plans for the 17 Kakaako Community Development District, but has permitted 18 development proposals and plans by private developers to modify 19 existing community development plans for both the mauka and 20 makai regions of the Kakaako Community Development District; and 21

22 WHEREAS, in approving private development proposals and 23 plans, the Hawaii Community Development Authority has granted 24 variances that undermine existing community development plans, 25 ignore established protections, and threaten infrastructure

1 capacity, thereby disregarding community health, welfare, and 2 quality of life; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Community Development Authority has 5 disregarded and failed to act on community concerns that have been repeatedly expressed at the Authority's community meetings, 6 7 public hearings, and board meetings; and 8 9 WHEREAS, many of the building and other permits issued recently by the City and County of Honolulu for development 10 11 within the Kakaako Community Development District have been conditional due to insufficient information relating to water 12 and wastewater capacity and sufficiency of infrastructure within 13 the Development District; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the issuance of conditional building and 16 development permits is counterproductive to the maintenance of a 17 reliable permitting process and contradicts established 18 regulations; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 21 22 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2014, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii 23 24 Community Development Authority is urged to immediately rescind any approval granted or permits awarded for the development of 25 residential towers within the Kakaako mauka portion of the 26 27 Kakaako Community Development District; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a one-year moratorium shall be imposed on the Hawaii Community Development Authority's approval 30 of development proposals and projects within the Kakaako 31 32 -Community Development District until the Authority addresses the sufficiency of infrastructure for sewer, water, road, park, and 33 school needs within the Development District by providing for 34 35 the completion of: 36 A supplemental environmental impact study disclosing 37 (1) 38 road, water, and sewer capacity challenges and available mitigation measures throughout the 39 Development District; 40 41 (2) A comprehensive carrying capacity study by the 42 43 University of Hawaii's Environmental Center to address the impact of development within the Development 44
