H.C.R. NO. 172

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DIRECTOR OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO ASSESS THE SCOPE AND FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING AN EMERGENCY SERVICES PATIENT ADVOCATE PROGRAM.

1 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that sick and vulnerable patients and their family members can easily become overwhelmed 2 within the medical system, especially when emergency medical 3 attention is necessary; and 4 5 WHEREAS, patients may be unaware of their rights regarding 6 the treatment and care they receive from their emergency room 7 physicians; and 8 9 WHEREAS, patients or family members may disagree with the 10 diagnosis or treatment plan provided by the emergency room 11 physicians, but they feel forced to accept the treatment plan 12 despite their concerns because they are unaware of how to 13 14 effectively exercise their rights to secure appropriate and available emergency medical care; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the Legislature further finds that a patient 17 18 advocate is needed to assist in the effective case management of, and to enhance communication among, patients, family 19 members, and health care providers in emergency situations; now, 20 therefore, 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 24 Session of 2014, the Senate concurring, that the Director of 25 Health is urged to convene a task force to assess the scope and 26 feasibility of establishing an emergency services patient 27 advocate program to provide assistance to, and advocate on 28 behalf of, patients receiving emergency medical care; and 29



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health or the 1 director's designee serve as the chairperson of the task force; 2 3 and 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force consist of the 5 6 following members: 7 The Director of Health or the director's designee; 8 (1)9 (2) Four representatives from the Healthcare Association 10 of Hawaii, each of whom is to be a resident of one 11 each of the following counties: City and County of 12 Honolulu, County of Hawaii, County of Kauai, and 13 14 County of Maui; 15 Four representatives from the Statewide Health (3) 16 Coordinating Council established under section 323D-17 18 13, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 19 (4) Three community-patient members who shall be appointed 20 by the Director of Health; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force: 23 24 Examine and identify current practices in emergency 25 (1)services patient advocacy; 26 27 (2) Assess and identify best practices in emergency 28 services patient advocacy; 29 30 (3) Make recommendations on how to effectively implement 31 an emergency services patient advocate program, 32 33 including a timetable for implementation; and 34 35 (4) Determine the costs of implementing, and resources necessary to implement, an emergency services patient 36 advocate program; and 37 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no member of the task force be 39 subject to Chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely because 40 of that member's participation as a member of the task force; 41 42 and



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force submit a report 1 of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed 2 3 legislation, to the Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2015; and 4 5 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report include the task 7 force's actions in assessing the scope and feasibility of 8 establishing an emergency services patient advocate program; and 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be terminated on 10 11 June 30, 2015; and 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 13 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health, 14 President and Chief Executive Officer of the Healthcare 15 Association of Hawaii, and the Chairperson of the Statewide 16 Health Coordinating Council. 17 18 19 20
