## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

## REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING A HOLIDAY LIGHT RECYCLING PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the State generates over one million tons of waste 1 each year, creating a severe strain on our State's environmental 2 and natural resources as well as the State's densely populated 3 landfills; and 4 5 WHEREAS, there were over twenty million Christmas trees 6 sold in the United States in 2013 and an estimated one hundred 7 fifty million strings of lights sold each year; and 8 9 WHEREAS, some states have created recycling programs that 10 collect holiday lights and then recycle the lights by separating 11 the copper, glass, and other materials from the lights, which 12 are then recycled; and 13 14 WHEREAS, copper is one of the world's most common and 15 reusable metals, resulting in the high demand for and cost of 16 copper; and 17 18 WHEREAS, some holiday light recycling programs have been so 19 successful that they have collected over a hundred thousand 20 pounds of holiday lights; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, any proceeds received from recycling holiday lights can be used for a multitude of programs and services 24 offered by the State that are in dire need of additional 25 funding; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the establishment of a holiday light recycling 28 program can serve as an additional way for community service 29 organizations and others to serve the community; now, therefore, 30 31
