## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING CONCERN OVER PERSISTENT AND CREDIBLE REPORTS OF SYSTEMATIC, STATE-SANCTIONED ORGAN HARVESTING FROM NON-CONSENTING PRISONERS OF CONSCIENCE, IN THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA, INCLUDING FROM LARGE NUMBERS OF FALUN GONG PRACTITIONERS IMPRISONED FOR THEIR RELIGIOUS BELIEFS AND MEMBERS OF OTHER RELIGIONS AND ETHNIC MINORITY GROUPS.

1 WHEREAS, the People's Republic of China implemented 2 regulations in 1984 that permitted the harvesting of organs from 3 executed prisoners; and 4

5 WHEREAS, due in part to traditional views on the importance 6 of preserving the body intact after death, China has very low 7 rates of voluntary organ donations; and

9 WHEREAS, the People's Republic of China performs more than 10 ten thousand organ transplantations per year, yet as of May 11 2013, it did not have an organized or effective public system of 12 organ donation or distribution; and

14 WHEREAS, in June 2001, Chinese doctor Wang Guoqi testified 15 before the United States House of Representatives' International 16 Relations Subcommittee on International Organizations and Human 17 Rights that hospitals worked in collusion with state security 18 agencies to extract organs from executed prisoners without 19 written consent of the organ donors, and that these transplants 20 were a lucrative source of income; and

22 WHEREAS, the United States Department of State's Country 23 Report on Human Rights Practices for China for 2011 stated, 24 "Overseas and domestic media and advocacy groups continued to 25 report instances of organ harvesting, particularly from Falun 26 Gong practitioners and Uighurs"; and

28 WHEREAS, in September 2012, experts testified before the
29 United States House of Representatives' Foreign Affairs

Committee that United States patients continue to travel to 1 2 China for organ transplants and that the medical community continues cooperation and training with Chinese colleagues, 3 creating the risk that they may be indirectly aiding abusive 4 5 practices; and 6 WHEREAS, China's former Vice-Minister of Health Huang Jiefu 7 admitted publicly that more than ninety per cent of transplant 8 organs extracted from deceased donors stemmed from executed 9 10 prisoners in China; and 11 WHEREAS, voluntary and informed consent is the precondition 12 for ethical organ donation and international medical 13 14 organizations state that prisoners, deprived of their freedom, are not in a position to give free consent and that the practice 15 of sourcing organs from prisoners is a violation of ethical 16 guidelines in medicine; and 17 18 WHEREAS, Falun Gong is an ancient spiritual discipline 19 which emphasizes moral teachings of truthfulness, compassion, 20 and tolerance, also includes meditation and exercises, and 21 became immensely popular in the 1990s, reaching over seventy 22 million practitioners in China; and 23 24 WHEREAS, in July 1999, the Chinese Communist Party launched 25 an intensive, nationwide campaign of persecution designed to 26 eradicate the spiritual practice of Falun Gong, reflecting the 27 party's long-standing intolerance of large and independent civil 28 29 societal groups; and 30 31 WHEREAS, since 1999, hundreds of thousands of Falun Gong practitioners have been detained illegally in reeducation-32 through-labor camps, detention centers, and prisons, where 33 torture and abuse are routine; and 34 35 WHEREAS, the number of organ transplant operations in China 36 increased significantly after 1999, corresponding with the onset 37 of the persecution of Falun Gong; and 38 39 WHEREAS, this increase does not appear to be attributable 40 either to an overall increase in the number of death row inmates 41 42 or to an increase in voluntary donations, and, in fact, human rights groups and legal experts believe there has been a 43





decrease in the number of executions in China in recent years; 1 and 2 3 WHEREAS, Chinese hospitals have advertised waiting times of 4 two to four weeks for kidney and liver transplants, and 5 documented cases of scheduled heart transplantations with three 6 7 weeks advance notice; and 8 9 WHEREAS, because organs have a very limited survival period outside the body, such short wait times are best explained by 10 11 the existence of a large pool of living donors whose organs can be harvested on demand; and 12 13 WHEREAS, interviews conducted with previously imprisoned 14 Falun Gong practitioners suggest that, while in custody, they 15 were targeted for medical exams, including blood and urine 16 tests, x-rays, ultra-sound tests, and selective physical exams; 17 18 and 19 20 WHEREAS, the targeted nature of these exams suggests they are intended to assess the health of the practitioners' vital 21 organs and their potential candidacy for organ harvesting; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, other prisoner groups are generally not subjected to such medical tests; and 25 26 WHEREAS, in 2006, doctors from seventeen Chinese hospitals 27 admitted in phone calls with undercover investigators that they 28 used or could obtain vital organs of Falun Gong prisoners of 29 conscience for transplant, with some of the doctors implicating 30 local courts and security agencies in the organ procurement 31 process; and 32 33 WHEREAS, the United Nations Committee Against Torture and 34 the Special Rapporteur on Torture have expressed concern over 35 the allegations of organ harvesting from Falun Gong prisoners, 36 and have called on the Government of the People's Republic of 37 China to increase accountability and transparency in the organ 38 transplant system and punish those responsible for abuses; and 39 40 WHEREAS, the killing of religious or political prisoners 41 for the purpose of selling their organs for transplant is an 42 43 egregious and intolerable violation of the fundamental right to life; now, therefore, 44 HCR LRB 14-0293.doc

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 2 3 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2014, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature 4 calls on the Government of the People's Republic of China to 5 immediately end the practice of organ harvesting from prisoners, 6 and particularly from Falun Gong prisoners of conscience and 7 members of other religious and ethnic minority groups; and 8 9

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the United States Department of 10 11 State is urged to issue a travel warning for United States citizens traveling to China for organ transplants informing them 12 that the organ source for their operation may be a prisoner of 13 conscience; and 14

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 16 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 17 United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of 18 Representatives, Hawaii's congressional delegation, the United 19 States Secretary of State, and the Ambassador of the People's 20 Republic of China to the United States. 21
