HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO WORK WITH CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY REPRESENTATIVES TO REVIEW THE PREREQUISITES FOR OBTAINING PERMIT APPROVAL FOR DEVELOPMENTS AT THE STATE AND COUNTY LEVELS.

WHEREAS, a coordinated effort between all levels of government and the private sector is necessary to expedite a sluggish and duplicative approval process for construction projects; and

WHEREAS, for over twenty years, the State and counties have imposed financial requirements, such as community facilities district financing, impact fees, and infrastructure construction on developers as prerequisites to obtaining approval for developments; and

WHEREAS, as a result of these financial impositions, infrastructure construction costs may rise, and construction sometimes remains unfinished: and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to understand the effects of imposing prerequisites on the cost of construction and development, including the effect upon the communities where development has been directed; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2014, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to work with construction industry representatives to review the prerequisites for obtaining permit approval for developments at the State and county levels with a view toward cost containment, community benefits, expedition of construction and permitting, and uniformity in imposition of prerequisites from one development project to the next; and
