HOUSE RESOLUTION

IN SUPPORT OF DECLARING 'A'Ā AS THE HAWAII STATE ROCK.

1 WHEREAS, volcanoes have a deep and rich cultural significance to Native Hawaiians and current residents of the 2 3 State; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the majesty and beauty of volcanoes, both active and inactive, are enjoyed by residents and visitors alike; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Hawaiian islands are volcanic in origin; and 8 9 WHEREAS, each Hawaiian island is made up of at least one 10 primary volcano, although many islands are composites of more 11 than one volcano; and 12 13 WHEREAS, lava rock ('A'ā) is expelled by volcanoes during 14 eruptions; and 15 16 WHEREAS, 'A'ā is one of three basic types of lava rock and 17 is characterized by a rough, jagged spinose, and generally 18 clinkery surface; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, 'A'ā is the rarest of the three types of lava rock; now, therefore, 22

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2014, that this body hereby declares 'A'ā as the state rock to honor the creation of the State and the cultural significance thereof; and
