HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A TASK FORCE TO DETERMINE METHODS OF ENSURING THE ACCURACY OF MAILING ADDRESSES IN VOTER REGISTRATION RECORDS.

WHEREAS, a thriving democracy is largely dependent on 1 government services and processes that promote effective citizen 2 participation; and 3 4 WHEREAS, accurate mailing addresses in voter registration 5 records are essential to ensuring that voters receive absentee 6 ballots and notices of polling place assignments; and 7 8 WHEREAS, voter registration records may contain incorrect 9 mailing addresses for various reasons, including the failure of 10 voters to provide notifications of address changes, 11 redistricting that alters voter districts, or errors in data 12 entry or recordkeeping systems; and 13 14 WHEREAS, Hawaii's low voter turnout rate, typically one of 15 the worst in the nation, underscores the need to ensure that 16 voter registration records contain accurate and up-to-date 17 information that allows Hawaii's citizens to exercise their 18 right to vote; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 21 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 22 Session of 2014, that the Chief Election Officer is requested to 23 convene a task force to determine methods of ensuring the 24 accuracy of mailing addresses in voter registration records; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Election Officer is 27 requested to invite the following parties to participate as 28 members of the task force: 29 30 The County Clerk of each county, or their respective (1)31 designees; 32 33 A representative from the League of Women Voters of 34 (2)
