HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A WORKING GROUP TO RECOMMEND WAYS TO REDUCE INCIDENTS OF SEPSIS AND SEPSIS DEATHS IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, sepsis is a serious medical condition that is caused by an overwhelming immune response to infection, whereby immune chemicals released into the blood to combat infection trigger widespread inflammation; and

WHEREAS, the United States National Library of Medicine and National Institutes of Health indicate that for sepsis, blood pressure drops, resulting in shock, and major organs and body systems, including the kidneys, liver, lungs, and central nervous systems, stop working properly because of poor blood flow; and

WHEREAS, sepsis can lead to shock, organ failure, and death; and

WHEREAS, according to the National Institute of General Medical Services, every year, severe sepsis strikes about 750,000 Americans, of which an estimated 28 percent to 50 percent will die, which is far more than the number of deaths in the United States from prostate cancer, breast cancer, and AIDS (acquired immunodeficiency syndrome) combined; and

WHEREAS, sepsis is among the leading causes of death in the United States; and preventive measures are needed immediately to address this rising health problem; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2014, that the Director of Health is requested to convene a working group to recommend ways to reduce incidents of sepsis and sepsis deaths in the State; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health serve as the chair of the working group; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health and the President and Chief Executive Officer of the Healthcare Association of Hawaii.
