## HOUSE RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING THE SUPPORT OF THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII FOR THE TROOP TALENT ACT OF 2013.

1 WHEREAS, members of the United States Armed Forces are 2 dedicated to protecting the many freedoms that we enjoy through 3 discipline, hard work, and self-sacrifice; and 4 5 WHEREAS, for many veterans the transition from military to 6 civilian life is often a difficult one which is cuident in the

6 civilian life is often a difficult one, which is evident in the
7 higher unemployment rates experienced by post September 11th
8 veterans; a rate that is currently 9.4 percent, which is greater
9 than the national average which is 6.7 percent; and

WHEREAS, even though many veterans leave the military with valuable skills and training, several obstacles such as injuries, lack of civilian work experience, and license and certification issues hamper a smooth transition from military to civilian life; and

WHEREAS, H.R. 1796, or the Troop Talent Act of 2013, was
created to ensure that veterans and members of the Armed Forces
are provided with the proper education and training to better
assist them in obtaining civilian certifications and licenses,
as well as for other purposes to assist veterans in adjusting to
civilian life; and

24 WHEREAS, the Troop Talent Act of 2013 directs the 25 Secretaries of the military departments, to the maximum extent 26 practicable, to make information on civilian credentialing 27 opportunities available to members of the Armed Forces beginning 28 with, and at every stage of, their training for military 29 occupational specialties in order to permit such members to:

(1) Evaluate the extent to which such training correlates with skills and training required for various civilian certifications and licenses; and

1 WHEREAS, the Troop Talent Act of 2013 requires the military 2 occupational specialties designated for a military skills to 3 civilian credentialing pilot program under the National Defense 4 Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2012 to include those 5 specialties relating to the military information technology 6 workforce; and 7

8 WHEREAS, the Troop Talent Act of 2013 directs the Secretary 9 of Veterans Affairs to reestablish the Professional 10 Certification and Licensure Advisory Committee which was 11 terminated on December 31, 2006, and provides the Committee with 12 additional duties, including the development of:

 Guidance for audits of licensure and certification programs in order to ensure high-quality education to members of the Armed Services and veterans; and

(2) A plan to improve outreach to members of the Armed Services and veterans on the importance of licensing and certification and the availability of educational benefits; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
Session of 2014, that this body supports the Troop Talent Act of
2013 along with its passage; and
