CONGRATULATING MATTHEW LAWRENCE AS THE 2014 HAWAII STATE TEACHER OF THE YEAR, TERESA CRAMER AS THE 2014 CENTRAL OAHU DISTRICT TEACHER OF THE YEAR, TERRA WIGHT AS THE 2014 LEEWARD OAHU DISTRICT TEACHER OF THE YEAR, DAYNA HIRONAKA AS THE 2014 WINDWARD OAHU DISTRICT TEACHER OF THE YEAR, ELIZABETH TIMBAL AS THE 2014 HAWAII DISTRICT TEACHER OF THE YEAR, ANTHONY WILLIAMS AS THE 2014 MAUI DISTRICT TEACHER OF THE YEAR, AND JUSTIN YAMAGATA AS THE 2014 KAUAI DISTRICT TEACHER OF THE YEAR.

1 WHEREAS, the people of the State of Hawaii take pride in 2 recognizing and honoring the superb achievements and notable 3 contributions of educators who, through their extraordinary 4 dedication and personal efforts, significantly improve the 5 quality of education in Hawaii; and

WHEREAS, a math and science teacher at Waikiki Elementary
School since 2001, MATTHEW LAWRENCE is a National Board
Certified Teacher who earned a bachelor's degree in Elementary
Education with Middle School Endorsement from Illinois State
University and a master's degree in Educational Psychology from
the University of Hawaii at Manoa; and

WHEREAS, while relevancy and project-based learning are features of MATTHEW LAWRENCE's teaching style, he also integrates the Philosophy for Children concept to mold his classroom into a community of thinkers; and

WHEREAS, MATTHEW LAWRENCE served as the School Community
 Council chair from 2006 to 2011, and is also a mentor teacher
 with the University of Hawaii undergraduate teaching program;

24 WHEREAS, in 2007, MATTHEW LAWRENCE launched a science fair 25 to provide students with a venue to share their experiments and 26 creations with their peers and family members; and



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WHEREAS, in recognition of his creative teaching methods, 1 the genuine care he shows for his students, and his unwavering 2 3 commitment to self-improvement, MATTHEW LAWRENCE was selected 4 from over 11,000 educators in the State as the 2014 Hawaii State 5 Teacher of the Year; and 6 7 WHEREAS, after spending ten years as a social worker 8 helping high-risk children in shelters and outreach programs, TERESA CRAMER changed careers and became a teacher; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, now serving as a fifth grade special education 12 teacher, TERESA CRAMER piloted Hale Kula Elementary School's 13 first co-teaching inclusion class; she also spearheaded the creation of a Hope Garden, an outdoor classroom that engages 14 students in hands-on learning and valuable sustainability 15 16 lessons; and 17 WHEREAS, in recognition of her professionalism and 18 dedication to motivating her students to do their best, TERESA 19 20 CRAMER has been named the 2014 Central Oahu District Teacher of 21 the Year; and 22 23 WHEREAS, TERRA WIGHT has demonstrated a tireless commitment to enriching the lives of her students at Nanakuli High and 24 25 Intermediate School by instilling in them an appreciation for the application of science; and 26 27 WHEREAS, TERRA WIGHT gives lessons that combine scientific 28 facts with relevancy, thereby allowing her students to 29 experience and understand science in the world around them; she 30 also helped initiate an ecology club through which students and 31 32 community members partner together to restore native plants to Piliokahe Beach Park; and 33 34 35 WHEREAS, in recognition of her leadership, commitment, and outstanding contributions to Nanakuli High and Intermediate 36 37 School, TERRA WIGHT has been selected as the 2014 Leeward Oahu District Teacher of the Year; and 38



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1 WHEREAS, a teacher at Kahaluu Elementary School, DAYNA 2 HIRONAKA strives to turn her students' natural curiosity into a lifelong love of learning, and she measures her success by her 3 4 students' accomplishments and academic progress; and 5 WHEREAS, DAYNA HIRONAKA's dedication to teaching extends 6 beyond the regular school day and the confines of the school 7 campus; after the bell rings, Dayna can be seen tutoring 8 students, meeting with parents, and collaborating with her 9 peers; she also mentors student teachers at Hawaii Pacific 10 University, believing that "the stronger the teachers, the more 11 successful students will be"; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, in recognition of her strong commitment to 15 infusing her students with the joy of learning, DAYNA HIRONAKA has been named the 2014 Windward Oahu District Teacher of the 16 17 Year; and 18 19 WHEREAS, due to her classroom management and genuine care for her students, ELIZABETH TIMBAL has served as a model 20 educator for Keaau High School's 10th grade English students and 21 strives to ensure that her students receive an education that 22 23 will enrich their lives and allow them to contribute to their communities; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, at Keaau High School, ELIZABETH TIMBAL helped 27 spearhead the implementation of the Advancement Via Individual Determination program, joined its new teacher induction program, 28 29 and developed an Extended Learning Opportunity program; and 30 31 WHEREAS, always striving to improve her craft, ELIZABETH TIMBAL also completed an English Language Learner course to 32 33 better understand her students' needs; and 34 35 WHEREAS, in recognition of her dedication to enriching her students' lives and helping them discover talents they never 36 knew they had, ELIZABETH TIMBAL has been selected as the 2014 37 Hawaii District Teacher of the Year; and 38



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1 WHEREAS, ANTHONY WILLIAMS earned a Bachelor of Arts degree 2 from the University of Hawaii at Manoa and is a valued mentor at the University of Hawaii at Hilo's Hawaiian Immersion Teacher 3 Development Program; and 4 5 WHEREAS, at Paia Elementary, ANTHONY WILLIAMS teaches 6 fourth grade Hawaiian immersion and started a hula halau to 7 address the needs of his students; to engage the parents of his 8 students at Paia Elementary, he takes the time to offer Hawaiian 9 language classes at night, three times a week; and 10 11 WHEREAS, ANTHONY WILLIAMS has shown remarkable commitment, 12 13 dedication, and devotion to his students by encouraging them to 14 strive to do their best every day in his classroom at Paia 15 Elementary School; and 16 17 WHEREAS, in recognition of his leadership, commitment, and numerous contributions to his community, ANTHONY WILLIAMS has 18 been selected as the 2014 Maui District Teacher of the Year; and 19 20 WHEREAS, a teacher at Waimea Canyon Middle School, JUSTIN 21 YAMAGATA has been instrumental in building Waimea Canyon's 22 23 science curriculum as department head and a member of the school's leadership team; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, when JUSTIN YAMAGATA first joined Waimea Canyon Middle School eight years ago, he was surprised to learn that 27 students were not competing in the science fair; today, thanks 28 29 to his perseverance, up to 100 student experiments are displayed in science events each year, with many qualifying for state and 30 31 even international tournaments; and 32 33 WHEREAS, students praise JUSTIN YAMAGATA's encouragement 34 and individualized guidance; as one of his former students noted: "Without his support, many of his students such as myself 35 would not have had the opportunity to discover our own 36 passions"; and 37 38 WHEREAS, in acknowledgement of his leadership, vision, and 39 dedication to his community, JUSTIN YAMAGATA has been named the 40 2014 Kauai District Teacher of the Year; now, therefore, 41
