HOUSE RESOLUTION

HONORING AND CONGRATULATING THE HOKULEA AND HER CREW ON THEIR MALAMA HONUA WORLDWIDE VOYAGE.

WHEREAS, the Hokule'a is a traditionally navigated vessel 1 that proved the probability of intentional Polynesian voyaging 2 and settlement of the largest ocean in the world when she first 3 sailed from Hawai'i to Tahiti in 1976 under the traditional 4 navigation skills of one of the earth's last master navigators; 5 and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, the Hökūle'a began reconnecting the peoples of the 9 Pacific, rekindling pride and aspiration among Native Hawaiians and Pacific islanders; and 10 11 WHEREAS, with her remarkable mentors and teachers, 12 13 including Herb Kane, Tommy Holmes, Ben Finney, Nainoa Thompson, 14 Mau Piailug, and many others, the Hokule'a became a catalyst for positive change in Hawai'i while forming and nurturing 15 relationships around the world based on shared values and 16 responsibility for caring for our natural resources; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the Hokule'a continues to voyage, carrying Hawai'i's diverse and openhearted culture throughout the Pacific, 20 bringing together Pacific island communities and voices, and 21 setting an environmental and culture-based educational example 22 for our children to realize the hope and potential in 23 themselves, their heritage, and their world; and 24 25 WHEREAS, voyaging on the Höküle'a teaches each crewmember 26 the individual and collective responsibilities of caring for 27 28 oneself, one another, the canoe, and the ocean in a manner that is respectful and sustainable; and 29

WHEREAS, the Hokule'a seeks to carry learned and shared 1 2 experiences from 38 years of traditional voyaging across more than 140,000 miles of Pacific Ocean waters on a worldwide 3 4 voyage; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the Höküle'a's Mālama Honua Worldwide Voyage will cover a distance of 47,000 miles over a four-year period, and 7 8 will visit 85 ports in 26 countries; and 9 10 WHEREAS, during the Mālama Honua Worldwide Voyage, the Hōkūle'a hopes to raise awareness of the importance of ocean 11 12 protection for the survival of life on earth; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the Hōkūle'a intends to raise awareness of the issues confronting Hawaii's shorelines, reefs, and deep waters, 15 while honoring and sharing Hawaiian knowledge and practices of 16 natural resource management; now, therefore, 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, 20 Regular Session of 2014, that this body hereby extends its sincerest 21 appreciation and deepest gratitude to the Hokule'a and her crew 22 23 for their outstanding contributions to the voyaging community and to Hawaiian and Polynesian culture. 24 25 26 27 OFFERED BY:
