
HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING CONGRESS AND HAWAII'S CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION TO SUPPORT
THE VETERANS HEALTH AND BENEFITS IMPROVEMENT ACT OF 2013
AND SUPPORT THE RECOGNITION AS VETERANS OF THOSE WHO SERVE
IN THE NATIONAL GUARD.

1 WHEREAS, the National Guard's roots date back to 1636, when
2 colonial militias made up of ordinary citizens would put down
3 their plows and pick up weapons to protect families and towns
4 from hostile attacks; and

6 WHEREAS, commonly known as citizen-soldiers, members of
7 today's National Guard hold civilian jobs or attend college
8 while maintaining their military training part-time, always
9 ready to defend the American way of life in the event of an
10 emergency; and

12 WHEREAS, while the National Guard originally focused on
13 protecting local communities, it eventually grew into a force
14 that complements the active-duty military when help is needed
15 anywhere in the world, including serving overseas in combat-
16 deployment roles; and

18 WHEREAS, although the National Guard's primary area of
19 operation is the National Guard unit's home state, National
20 Guard members are often called on by the President of the United
21 States to respond to, among other things, homeland security
22 missions, domestic emergencies, counterdrug efforts, and
23 reconstruction missions in addition to overseas combat missions;

26 WHEREAS, while many National Guard members have similar
27 duties and perform similar functions to their counterparts in
28 the active-duty military, Title 38, United States Code, excludes
29 from the definition of veteran, career reserve-component members
30 who have not served on active duty under Title 10, United States
31 Code, for other than training purposes; and
