## HOUSE RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO ESTABLISH A FETAL ALCOHOL SPECTRUM DISORDER INTERAGENCY COORDINATING COUNCIL TO COORDINATE AND DEVELOP FETAL ALCOHOL SPECTRUM DISORDER INFORMATION, EDUCATION, POLICIES, AND SUPPORT SERVICES.

WHEREAS, fetal alcohol spectrum disorder is one of the most 1 2 underdiagnosed developmental disabilities in Hawaii and across the country; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, nationwide, approximately forty thousand newborns per year are affected by fetal alcohol spectrum disorder; and 6 7 WHEREAS, according to Hawaii pregnancy risk assessment 8 monitoring system data, one thousand three hundred women who 9 qave birth in Hawaii during the years 2009 to 2011 reported that 10 they drank alcohol in the last trimester of their pregnancy, and 11 two hundred women per year reported binge drinking during their 12 last trimester; and 13 14 WHEREAS, there are more cases of fetal alcohol spectrum 15 disorder than down syndrome, cerebral palsy, sudden infant death 16 syndrome, cystic fibrosis, and spina bifida combined; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the effects of prenatal alcohol exposure are lifelong and can include physical, mental, behavioral, and 20 learning disabilities; and 21 22 WHEREAS, fetal alcohol exposure is the leading cause of 23 intellectual disabilities in the United States, and individuals 24 with diagnosed or undiagnosed fetal alcohol exposure often 25 suffer from secondary disabilities such as child abuse and 26 neqlect, family separation, multiple foster placements, school 27 related failure, juvenile delinquency, job instability, 28 depression, aggression, and other serious mental health 29 disorders; and 30 31 32 WHEREAS, the intellectual disabilities and secondary

33 disabilities come at a high cost to the individual, their 34 families, and society; and

1 WHEREAS, caring for someone with fetal alcohol spectrum 2 disorder costs between \$1,400,000 and \$1,500,000 over a .3 lifetime; and 4 5 WHEREAS, fetal alcohol spectrum disorder is completely 6 preventable, and the devastating effects of fetal alcohol 7 exposure can be substantially reduced by early diagnosis and 8 9 appropriate, effective intervention; and 10 WHEREAS, poor coordination of resources hampers prevention, 11 12 diagnosis, and service delivery; and 13 WHEREAS, fourteen states nationwide have established 14 permanent fetal alcohol spectrum disorder coordinators who serve 15 as key educational, informational, and coordinative links 16 between departments and agencies dealing with persons with fetal 17 alcohol spectrum disorder; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the fetal alcohol spectrum disorder-specific 20 services that exist in Hawaii are very minimal and the State 21 does not have any coordinated effort to address the issue; and 22 23 WHEREAS, fetal alcohol spectrum disorder is a statewide 24 public health concern that has service, policy, and economic 25 implications for virtually all state departments; now, 26 therefore, 27 28 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 29 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 30 Session of 2014, that the Department of Health is encouraged to 31 establish a Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder Interagency 32 33 Coordinating Council within the Department's Family Health Services Division to coordinate and develop fetal alcohol 34 spectrum disorder information, education, policies, and support 35 36 services statewide; and 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council comprise no more 38 than seventeen members as follows; provided that each member 39 representing a state agency be a person with the authority to 40 influence policy in the member's respective agency: 41 42 43 (1)At least three individuals who have fetal alcohol spectrum disorder or who are immediate relatives or 44 2014-1599 HR SMA.doc
